

# Over 13,000 dead, 600,000 homeless in Turkey Quake

ISTANBUL, Turkey (Aug. 20) - More than 13,000 bodies have thus far been recovered from the rubble caused by a powerful earthquake that struck northwestern Turkey on August 17. The earthquake was centered in the industrial rown of Izmit, approximately 90 km (56 miles) east of Istanbul, measuring 7.4 on the Richter scale. Over 30,000 people have been reported injured and over 600,000 left homeless.

The tremor shook the city before dawn while most were asleep, trapping many inside their homes. Shortly after, a fire engulfed Turkey's biggest oil refinery and clouds of thick black smoke tolled skyward as firefighting aircraft fought the blaze.

Rescuers caurioned that lack of clean water and roders coupled with the

intense summer heat could spread disease and drive the death toll even higher

Three trapped victims were rescued from crumbled buildings three days after the quake. The disaster threatens to rival Turkey's most destructive quake - a 7.9 quake in 1939 that killed 33,000 people.

Sergio Piazzi, an official with the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs based in Geneva, said Turkish officials estimated that as many as 35,000 people were still unaccounted for.

Medics immunized rescue workers against typhoid and warned of health risks for the multitude of quake victims who are crowded in parks or along roadsides in the sweltering heat under

makeshift tents.

The stench of decay pervaded flattened towns near the quake's epicenter where sewage lines were smashed and electricity and water was cut. Thousands of people, many with open wounds, were forced to live on the streets.

"There are wild problems with organization," said Nurse Egemen Keskin.

The Prime Minister's crisis office said medical teams had begun picking up garbage, spraying disinfectants, and distributing water purification tablets.

"There are many people, animals and food under the debris," said Health Ministry official Rifat Kose. "An epidemic could occur as they decay, but we are taking necessary measures."

The World Health Organization in Geneva, however, called the health risk

from unburied cadavers "negligible," saying resources were better spent on providing portable toilets and clean water and monitoring for outbreaks.

Rallies to Protest Counter-Terrorism Bill in •
 San Francisco, Los Angeles

wo separate protests were held in San Francisco and Los Angeles to protest the Counter-Terrorism Bill.

The bill has been used by the U.S. Government to detain Muslims and freeze assets of those it deems as "terrorists."

Over 20 Muslims are currently imprisoned without charge, on the basis of "secret evidence."

Over 400 people attended the San Francisco protest, held at the San Francisco Civic Center, and about 140 attended the protest held at the Westwood Federal Building in Los Angeles.

Imam Abdul Alim Musa and Abdel Malik Ali of Masjid Al-Islam were speakers at both events. Other speakers at the Los Angeles demonstration included Imam Sa'dullah Khan (Islamic Center, So. Calif.), and Hussam Ayloush (CAIR). A third demonstration will inuha'Allah (God-willing) be held at Washington D.C.'s Lafayette Park at the end of September.

#### Philippine Government to Start Peace Talks with Muslims

MANILA, (Aug 2) - The Philippine government and the Moro Islamic Liberation Front (MILF), a Muslim revivalist group, are to hold formal peace talks next month, Philippine Defense Secretary Orlando Mercado said.

Mercado said both sides are still finalizing details of the talks, such as identifying 46 camps claimed to be under the control of the MILF in the country's southernmost island of Mindanao.

Identifying the camps is a prerequisite for the implementation of a 1997 agreement that calls for a general cessation of hostilities while the formal talks are in progress.

The government, however, is reductant to concede that a significant number of the camps are under MILF control.

The government asserts that identifying the camps must be done within the limits imposed by the Philippine Constitution and legal system, a demand the MILF refuses to accede to. • - The Kyado News Service.

#### Shaykh 'Umar 'Abd al-Rahman \* Tortured in Prison Cell

ROCHESTER, Minnesota - CNN Interactive confirmed on August 20, 1999 that Shaykh 'Umar 'Abd al-Rahman was attacked by a prison officer and suffered contusions. The attack occurred while the Shaykh was using the prison toilet. As a result of the attack, he fell down and then seems to have been dragged to his cell.

Shaykh 'Umar is the spiritual guide of the Jama'ah al-Islamiyyah in Egypt. The depth and support of this movement is witnessed by the fact that 70,000 associates of the group are now in Egyptian dictator Mubarak's prisons.

In 1996, Shaykh 'Umar was falsely accused of being a conspirator in the World Trade Center bombing, and was sentenced to life in prison. Before his sentence, Shaykh 'Umar told the judge, "This case is nothing but an extension of the American war against Islam." •
