Nuclear Reactors, Materials, and Waste Sector

 March 28, Asbury Park Press – (Pennsylvania) Oyster Creek nuclear plant returns to full power. The Oyster Creek nuclear plant in Lacey resumed normal operations March 28 after the unit automatically shut down March 22 due to an electrical issue in a system that regulates steam to the plant's turbines. Crews made repairs to the failed regulator, and technicians inspected and tested the electrical system before returning the unit to service.

4. March 27, Defense News - (Georgia) Lockheed pays \$2M to settle government

overbilling charges. The U.S. Department of Justice announced March 27 that Lockheed Martin Corporation agreed to pay \$2 million to resolve allegations that the company overbilled the Federal government for fuel it used while manufacturing the C-130 aircraft for the U.S. Air Force at its Marietta, Georgia facility from 2006 – 2013. Lockheed allegedly exceeded its fuel allotment of 22,000 gallons per aircraft and failed to reimburse the government for the excess, as well as used the allotted fuel on unrelated products where the government had not agreed to furnish fuel. 5. March 30, U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission – (National) SEC announces fraud charges against investment adviser accused of concealing poor performance of fund assets from investors. The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission charged an investment adviser and her New York-based Patriarch Partners firms with fraud March 30, for allegedly hiding the poor performance of loan assets in 3 collateralized loan obligation funds and collecting almost \$200 million in illegitimate fees from investors.

JetBlue Airways announced March 30 that a systemwide computer outage was resolved, causing delays for thousands of passengers after the airline had to issue handwritten boarding passes. The company stated that customers will likely face delays throughout the day while they worked to get operations back to normal. 9. March 28, Associated Press – (California) LA light rail train hits car, partially derails; 21 hurt. A Los Angeles Metro Expo line train slammed into a car at a crossing in front of the University of Southern California March 28 leaving 19 passengers injured as well as the car's driver and train's operator. Authorities are investigating the incident and believe the driver was attempting to turn at a grade crossing and did not see the approaching train.

10. March 28, WISC 3 Madison – (Wisconsin) Chemical spill shuts down I-90 most of Friday. An accident involving a semi-truck carrying 15 chemicals in 55-gallon drums that rear-ended another semi-truck parked on the shoulder of Interstate 39-90 in Janesville, Wisconsin, prompted the nearly 13 hour closure of westbound lanes March 27 while crews removed and cleaned up 4 damaged and leaking barrels found along the roadway. Over a dozen people were evacuated from nearby homes for 10 hours as a precaution.

11. *March 27, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (International) **Aurora Products, Inc. expands voluntary product recall to include certain private label branded walnut and trail mix products due to possible health risk.** The U.S. Food and Drug Administration announced March 27 that Aurora Products, Inc., expanded its voluntary nationwide recall of certain lots of natural walnuts and trail mixes containing walnuts to include several private label products due to possible Salmonella contamination. The affected products were distributed through retail stores nationwide, and in Canada and Bermuda.

14. March 26, Laguna Niguel – Dana Point Patch; San Francisco Bay City News – (California) Health officials warn of raw milk's risks after California illnesses. The California Department of Public Health warned the public of the dangers associated with the consumption of raw milk after six Bay Area residents were diagnosed with campylobacteriosis. A statewide recall of Claravale Farm products from San Benito County was issued March 22 after raw milk and raw cream samples tested positive for campylobacter. A precautionary boil water advisory was issued to nearly 150 customers in Hillsborough County March 29 due to a water main break on Riverview Road. Crews estimated that repair work to a connecting roadway between U.S. Highways 41 and 301 that was blocked as a result of the break will last at least through March 30.

Olympus America issued new cleaning guidelines March 26 to U.S. hospitals for its duodenoscopes that have been linked to infections of antibiotic-resistant bacteria in 11 patients at 2 separate Los Angeles hospitals in February. The updated guidelines recommend that hospitals and healthcare facilities use a smaller cleaning brush, to be provided by the company around May 8, and additional flushing steps to remove debris in the scopes. 22. *March 30, Help Net Security* – (International) **Massive DDoS against GitHub continues.** Systems engineers at GitHub reported that complex, large-scale distributed denial-of-service (DDoS) attacks against the company's servers that started March 26 are ongoing but that all of the Web site's services are available to users. Security researchers from Insight Labs traced the start of the attack to advertising and visitor tracking provided by the Chinese search engine Baidu. More than 80 people were evacuated from the Star America building and nearby homes in Concord, North Carolina, March 26 due to a sodium hydrosulfite leak from a barrel inside the hosiery producer's facility. Crews blocked storm drains to avoid a possible chemical reaction, while two workers were transported to an area hospital as a precaution.
