1. *March 31, Charleston Gazette* – (West Virginia) **Freedom Industries reaches deal with DEP on cleanup timeline.** The West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection approved March 27 a Voluntary Remediation Agreement proposed by Freedom Industries that outlines a series of reports and work that the company will perform to reclaim the site of a January 2014 chemical spill into the Elk River that contaminated the water supply of 300,000 residents. Final remediation is schedule to be complete in 2016, and all contamination at the site must be removed

2. *March 30, Minneapolis Star-Tribune* – (Minnesota) **Xcel nuclear power unit back online after false fire alarm.** Xcel Energy officials reported that the Unit 2 reactor at the Prairie Island Nuclear Generating Plant in Red Wing was back to full power March 28 after workers repaired a ruptured disk in a pressure tank that triggered the plant's fire alarm, affected the cooling and ventilation systems, and prompted the reactor to shut down March 5.

3. *March 30, Arkansas Department of Health* – (Arkansas) **Stolen radioactive gauge.** The Arkansas Department of Health, Radiation Control Program reported that a gauge containing radioactive material was stolen from a construction site in northwest Pulaski County March 30. The device is shielded but could present a radiation hazard if the radioactive sources are exposed or removed from their sealed container.

4. *March 30, U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission* – (Louisiana) **NRC begins special inspection at River Bend Station.** The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission initiated a special inspection at Entergy's River Bend nuclear power plant in St. Francisville March 30 to review circumstances surrounding March 9 and February 23 events in which equipment that provides cooling and ventilation to plant areas housing safety-related equipment failed to start.

5. *March 31, Pittsburgh Business Times* – (Minnesota) **U.S. Steel cuts more from Minnesota ore.** U.S. Steel Corp., announced March 31 that it will idle a portion of its Minnesota Ore Operations Minntac plant in Mt. Iron effective June 1, as part of ongoing company operational adjustments to market conditions. Operations at the Minntac plant will continue at reduced capacity in order to meet customer demand. 7. *March 31, WCAU 10 Philadelphia* – (Pennsylvania) **Deadly crash, involving FedEx tractor-trailer, closes Interstate 78 in Pennsylvania.** Police reported that a portion of Interstate 78 in Greenwich Township, Pennsylvania, will remain closed for at least 8 hours due to a 3-vehicle crash involving a FedEx semi-truck and 2 other vehicles that left several people injured March 31. 8. *March 31, KXAS 5 Fort Worth* – (Texas) **Explosion causes semitrailer collision on I-35E.** Interstate 35E in Lancaster, Texas, was expected to remain closed for at least 3 hours March 31 after a semi-truck carrying tires caught fire after driving across lanes of

traffic and colliding with another semi-truck near Parkerville Road March 31. One driver suffered injuries.

The airline reported that the plane was taken out of service for inspection and that passengers were placed on other flights.

11. *March 30, WCVB 5 Boston* – (Massachusetts) **Passenger at Logan found with 26 pounds of quail eggs.** U.S. Customs and Border Protection agriculture specialists successfully intercepted 26 pounds of quail eggs at Boston Logan International Airport after a passenger arriving from Vietnam declared the food to customs agents without the documentation required for all egg products originating from regions affected with avian flu. Customs agents destroyed the quail eggs and the rice hulls that they were wrapped in as a precaution.

12. *March 30, Honolulu Star-Advertiser* – (Hawaii) **Food warehouse to pay nearly \$200k in fines, fix safety flaws.** Unicold Corp., agreed to pay \$197,000 in penalties and to make health and safety improvements at its refrigerated food warehouse in Honolulu as part of a settlement with the U.S. Department of Labor that was announced March 30. The settlement was reached following a 2013 inspection that revealed health and safety violations that resulted in 63 citations for Unicold.

13. *March 30, Los Angeles Daily News*– (California) **Los Angeles seafood company L.A. Star closed for unhealthy conditions.** The U.S. Department of Justice announced

March 30 that a federal judge ordered L.A. Star Seafood Co. Inc., located in the Little Tokyo area of Los Angeles, to halt production and distribution of ready-to-eat smoked, salt-cured, and pickled seafood products due to unsanitary conditions that contributed to a failure to control the bacteria that causes listeriosis and botulism. The facility can reopen after specific steps are taken to come into compliance with the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act.

14. *March 28, Reuters* – (Minnesota) **Minn. finds third bird flu infection in commercial poultry flock.** The U.S. Department of Agriculture confirmed March 28 that a case of H5N2 flu was detected in a flock of 39,000 turkeys at a commercial poultry farm in Stearns County, prompting State officials to quarantine the farm and cull the flock to prevent the spread of the disease.

15. *March 28, Associated Press; Austin Daily Herald* – (Minnesota) **Farm with Jennie-O ties hit by bird flu outbreak.** Officials announced March 27 that a Lac qui Parle County turkey farm with ties to Hormel Foods Corp. subsidiary Jennie-O Turkey Store was struck with the H5N2 avian influenza strain, causing 22,000 birds to die and prompting officials to cull an additional 44,000 turkeys. Jennie-O Officials stated that the affected turkeys were not ready for market and no turkeys with the flu strain entered the food chain.

16. *March 28, Omaha World-Herald* – (Iowa) **Two Harlan co-op workers hospitalized in Omaha.** First responders removed and decontaminated two workers at the Farm Service Cooperative in Harlan that were exposed to anhydrous ammonia March 28 before the individuals were transported to area hospitals for treatment. Authorities ventilated the building and continue to investigate the cause of the ammonia release.

17. *March 30, Orange County Register* – (California) **Sewage spill closes a mile of San Clemente beach.** An outage at the San Clemente North Beach pump station caused 5,000 gallons of sewage to overflow into the ocean at the base of pier March 29 prompting officials to close a half-mile long stretch of the beach in each direction from the pier through at least April 1.

sewer overflows. Anne Arundel Health Department officials announced March 30 that Eli Cove in Pasadena, Maryland, will be closed until April 6 after 60,750 gallons of wastewater overflowed March 29 from a nearby sewer due to debris placed in a manhole near a county pump station. Authorities continue to investigate after determining the tributary of Stoney Creek was impacted by the spill.

19. *March 31, WRC 4 Washington, D.C.* – (Virginia; Washington, D.C.) **Man who escaped Inova Fairfax Hospital captured after 9-hour manhunt.** Police captured an escaped prisoner in Washington, D.C., March 31 who had overpowered a guard at Inova Fairfax Hospital in Virginia prompting the hospital and surrounding streets to be locked down for several hours before carjacking a vehicle. The driver of the vehicle crashed into a home after the suspect kicked out the backseat from inside the truck and fled, stealing another vehicle before he was captured by authorities.

20. *March 30, Wilmington Star-News* – (North Carolina) **Wilmington man pleads guilty to pharmacy robberies.** A suspect pleaded guilty March 30 to a series of pharmacy robberies in Wilmington April 2014 and January 2015 after police found over 3,000 prescription pills and a BB gun at his residence during his arrest.

21. *March 30, Associated Press* – (Hawaii) **VA Inspector: Honolulu supervisor manipulated veterans' benefit data to make team look better.** A report issued by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Office of Inspector General found that a supervisor at the Veterans Administration Office in Honolulu was manipulating data in 2014 by removing controls in the electronic record that are used to track and identify the progress of claims to make it look like the agency was processing benefits claims faster. The data manipulation caused delays for the delivery of benefits to 143 veterans and authorities have since taken corrective action on all improperly processed cases.

22. *March 31, Softpedia* – (Illinois) **Bradley University systems infected with malware, SSNs exposed.** Bradley University in Illinois reported that personally identifiable information (PII) including names, Social Security numbers, and dates of birth of about 4,700 former and current employees as well as retirees, and their spouses and

- dependents may have been exposed in a malware breach. Some employees were notified by the Internal Revenue Service that irregular activity was spotted on their tax filings.

23. *March 30, USA Today* – (International) **Former feds charged with stealing Silk Road bitcoin.** A former U.S. Secret Service agent surrendered to authorities March 30 and a U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration agent was arrested March 27 in connection to allegedly stealing over \$1.5 million in bitcoins while investigating the Silk Road, a shutdown underground site that traded in illegal drugs, counterfeit IDs, and computer hacking software. The pair, based in Maryland, stole proceeds from the site and hid the funds in offshore accounts, often utilizing their positions in the government to obtain the bitcoins.

25. *March 30, Atlanta Journal-Constitution; WSB 2 Atlanta* – (Georgia) **Four Public Works employees arrested on theft charges.** Police arrested and charged four Atlanta Department of Public Works employees March 30 in connection to stealing and selling city-owned metals to recycling centers over the course of several years after an audit found that the city lacked adequate controls for tracking its equipment and that millions of dollars in materials were unaccounted for. Two Department of Watershed Management employees were taken into custody the week of March 23 on similar charges.

Authorities reported to the scene to investigate the crash.

crews remained on site to monitor the area.

32. *March 30, KWES 9 Midland/Odessa* – (Texas) **Odessa man caught impersonating police officer.** A man was arrested in Odessa, Texas, March 30 by an off-duty police

officer for impersonating a police officer by using professionally installed flashing lights and sirens on his vehicle. The suspect admitted to impersonating a police officer on other occasions prior to his arrest.

33. *March 31, Softpedia* – (International) **Anonymous proxies used for “Shotgun DDoS” attacks.** Security researchers at Incapsula released findings from a one-month study revealing that 20 percent of all Layer 7 application layer distributed denial-of-service (DDoS) attacks from January – February were “Shotgun DDoS” attacks carried out through anonymous proxies to bypass mitigation systems by spreading across multiple internet protocols (IPs) and multiple geo-locations. Approximately 45 percent of the incidents originated from addresses in the Tor anonymity network and 60 percent of them employed Tor’s Hammer denial-of-service (DoS) tool, which carries out low-and-slow power-on self-test (POST) attacks.

34. *March 31, Softpedia* – (International) **Trojan Laziok used for reconnaissance in the energy sector.** Security researchers from Symantec identified new malware designed for stealing information, dubbed Laziok that was observed targeting users in the petroleum, gas, and helium industries worldwide, and is delivered via a malicious Microsoft Excel file that exploits a buffer overflow/security glitch that allows remote code execution, and downloads custom variants of Cyberat and Zbot malware from servers in the U.S., United Kingdom, and Bulgaria.

35. *March 31, Network World* – (International) **Lebanese cyberespionage campaign hits defense, telecom, media firms worldwide.** Security researchers at Check Point Software Technologies discovered that a cyberespionage group has hacked into hundreds of defense contractor, telecommunications operator, media group, and educational organization networks from at least 10 countries in ongoing attacks that began in late 2012. The attackers detect vulnerabilities and use Web shells to compromise affected servers, including a sophisticated custom-made trojan on servers running Microsoft’s IIS software called Explosive that can infect servers and systems on networks and can spread via USB mass storage devices.

36. *March 30, Threatpost* – (International) **eBay fixes file upload and path disclosure bugs.** eBay addressed two security vulnerabilities on its Web site that allowed attackers to upload malicious files, including executables, disguised as images that could be used

in drive-by download attacks by leveraging poor header check's and eBay server return messages with exact file paths.

37. *March 31, San Antonio Express-News* – (Texas) **Around 30 people evacuated from apartments after fire at River Walk restaurant.** A fire at Saltgrass Steak House along the San Antonio River Walk in Texas March 31 temporarily displaced about 30 residents of apartments located above the restaurant when smoke filled the units and authorities shut off electricity to the building.

38. *March 31, Hampton Roads Daily Press* – (Virginia) **Residents evacuated, potentially explosive device found at York mobile home park, officials say.** The Bethel Mobile Home Park in York County was evacuated March 31 while bomb squad crews searched the area for threats to safety and investigators recovered a potentially explosive device from a residence owned by a suspect that what arrested and charged with manufacturing and possessing explosive materials or devices during the week of March 23. The scene was cleared about 3 hours after the search began.

A Fiesta Texas spokesperson released that no negative impacts to the environment have been reported, and that the theme park is working to

come into compliance with the requirements.

40. *March 30, Missoula Missoulian* – (Montana) **Army Corps repairing Orchard Home Levee to protect homes.** The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers reported that a \$148,000 project to repair a 200-foot damaged segment of the Orchard Homes Levee in Missoula County began March 30 and will be completed by April 3 after the embankment was damaged in the spring of 2014 due to high flows. The repair work was approved by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in order to prevent potential damage to homes during flood season.
