## HEAD COACH TARA VANDERVEER

In a storied 35-year coaching career, Setsuko Ishiyama Director of Women's Basketball and Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame Class of 2011 member Tara VanDerveer has established herself as one of the top coaches in the history of both collegiate and international women's basketball.

Regarded in the profession as one of the most well-respected and dynamic coaches in the country, VanDerveer was inducted to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass. in August 2011. In 2002, she was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in Knoxville, Tenn.

An ambassador for both Stanford University and the sport of college basketball, VanDerveer has enjoyed an unprecedented level of success through an energetic and positive approach to the game. A 16-time conference coach of the year (14 Pac-12, two Big Ten), VanDerveer has accumulated an impressive 927-207 (.817) record over her 35-year career.

In 2013-14 VanDerveer became the fifth Division I women's basketball coach to win 900 games, doing so with an international flavor as the Cardinal defeated Florida Gulf Coast, 83-59, in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico on Nov. 27, 2013. VanDerveer's Cardinal posted a 33-4 record last season en route to another appearance in the Final Four.

In 2013-14 Stanford extended a couple of program milestones as it claimed its 14th straight Pac-12 regular-season title and made its 12th trip to the Final Four, and sixth in the past seven years. The 12 Final Four appearances keep Stanford third all-time among all schools in total trips to women's basketball's marquee event, and the conference regular-season title was also the Cardinal's 23rd in 28 years of Pac-12 women's basketball. Additionally, Stanford's NCAA Tournament appearance this year was its 28th, moving the Cardinal into third place past Louisiana Tech (27).

In addition to bringing home the John R. Wooden Award as the national player of the year, Chiney Ogumike was also voted a consensus All-American for her record-setting 2013-14 season. Ogumike averaged 26.1 points and 12.1 rebounds per game while shooting 60.1 percent from the field. Those numbers helped Ogumike earn her second straight selections to the ESPN, USBWA, John R. Wooden Award, and Associated Press First Teams, with the AP nod being her third overall after being named to the second team in 2012. Additionally, Ogumike was honored at the Final Four in Nashville by being named to the WBCA Coaches' All-America Team for the third straight season, joining Candice Wiggins (2005-08), Nnemkadi Ogumike (2010-12) and Nicole Powell (2002-04) as Stanford's only three-time WBCA All-Americans. She was also named the Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year and Capital One Academic All-American of the Year for women's basketball by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

VanDerveer possesses the third-highest career winning percentage among Division I women's basketball coaches, and has won two NCAA Championships and 25 conference titles (22 Pac-12, three Big Ten).

Over 28 seasons at Stanford, she owns an amazing 775-156 (.832) record. She has led the Cardinal to two NCAA Championships (1990, 1992), 11 NCAA Final Four appearances (1990-92, 1995-97, 2008-12, 2014), 22 Pac-12 Conference titles, 10 Pac-10 Tournament crowns and 25 trips to the NCAA Tournament.

Over the past seven seasons, VanDerveer has overseen one of the most successful programs in the nation as the Cardinal has accumulated a record of 238-23 (.912) and been one of just two programs to reach the Final Four at least six times. Stanford is also one of just four teams to reach the national title game twice since 2007-08.
