Please use the below standards to help answer the questions presented by the Stanford Device Information survey.

**Are you the primary user (or the party responsible for the data security) of this computer?**

<b>Yes</b>	If you are the person who uses this machine more than anyone else, make decisions about what applications are on it or would generally consider it "your" computer.
<b>No</b>	If this machine is in a computer lab or a general use machine.

**Do other people use this computer?**

<b>Yes</b>	If other people use this machine by logging in via another user name or use it using the same login as you for more than a few minutes a day.
<b>No</b>	If others only use it occasionally and do not have their own login.

**Is this a Stanford purchased computer?**

<b>Yes</b>	If this machine was paid for by your school, department, program, supervisor, PI, grant or other Stanford funds.
<b>Yes</b>	If this machine was paid for by you, using your personal funds and reimbursed by Stanford
<b>No</b>	If this machine was paid for by you, using your personal funds <i>and not reimbursed by Stanford</i>

**Is this computer used for Stanford-related work, including even minimal use of email, voicemail, or Stanford files?**

<b>Yes</b>	If you work with <i>any</i> data related to Stanford, not including personal data such as your pay statements, or personal benefits information.
<b>No</b>	If you do not do any work for Stanford on this machine or only have personal data from Stanford such as pay statements and personal benefits information.
