

Explaining Conservation Goals



- The state's 16% goal for EBMUD is based on state needs; 20% factors in our storage and supplemental supply uncertainties.
- 20% overall assumes varied cutbacks by season and class.
- "Musts and shoulds."



Public Outreach Goals




- Tell customers they <u>must</u> comply with mandatory outdoor use rules
- Tell customers they <u>should</u> strive for 35 gallons per day per person indoors
- Offer free devices and technical assistance to help customers conserve
- Explain supplemental supply actions





Water Waste Reporting and Enforcement








SWRCB Monthly Water Waste Reporting

Trucked Recycled Water



- In June, 257,000 gallons from North Richmond which offset potable commercial use in Richmond
- In June, 517,000 gallons from East Bayshore which offset potable commercial use in Oakland
- Investigating location for pilot residential fill station, in-service date to be determined

Recycled Water Distribution System Expansions



- San Ramon Valley-Bishop Ranch:
 - Pipeline construction June 2015 June 2016
 - 40 irrigation sites to be converted and connected
 - 425,000 gallons per day
- East Bayshore-Emeryville:
 - Pipeline construction summer 2015
 summer 2016
 - 15 irrigation sites to be converted and connected
 - 24,000 gallons per day

Supply-side Highlights



- Closely monitoring taste and smell complaints
- April June: 22,144 AF of CVP water delivered to terminal reservoirs
- July Aug: 11,106 AF
- Transfers: completing the environmental documentation and permitting for 25,000 AF
