# PI Eligibility Policy (RPH 2.1)

As adopted by the Senate of the Academic Council

 Limits eligibility to act as a principal investigator (PI) or coprincipal investigator (Co-PI) on externally-funded projects to members of the Academic Council and the MCL faculty

 There are two types of exceptions to the policy available to Clinician Educators through a PI waiver process



## **Types of PI Waivers for Clinician Educators**

Туре	General Guidelines
Career Development	<ul> <li>Available to faculty, including CEs, and academic staff.</li> <li>The stated purpose of the award must be to advance/enhance the individual's scientific career.</li> <li>The study must be executed under the mentorship of an established faculty advisor who is named in the proposal.</li> <li>The study must be conducted within the intellectual scope and space of the advisor, and must not require incremental space.</li> </ul>
Clinical Research	<ul> <li>Must hold rank of Clinical Assistant Professor, Clinical Associate Professor, or Clinical Professor.</li> <li>Eligible to be PI for studies that meet the NIH definition of Clinical Research or involve novel methods of clinical instruction.</li> <li>The Stanford scope of work by the CE cannot involve bench or lab-based activities.</li> <li>If the CE is part-time, study must be a clinical trial at Stanford</li> <li>If non-MD degree, must be engaged full-time in clinical care activities to be eligible.</li> <li>The waiver request from the Department Chair must state that the CE will have protected time available to conduct the prospective research study and that the Department Chair confirms the competency of the CE to serve as PI.</li> <li>Cannot serve as primary mentor of graduate students, though can mentor post-docs conducting clinical research</li> </ul>



## **NIH Clinical Research definition – Research that is:**

- 1. Patient-oriented research. Research conducted with human subjects (or on material of human origin such as tissues, specimens, and cognitive phenomena) for which an investigator (or colleague) directly interacts with human subjects. Excluded from this definition are in vitro studies that utilize human tissues that cannot be linked to a living individual. It includes: mechanisms of human diseases, therapeutic interventions, clinical trials, or development of new technologies.
- 2. Epidemiological and behavioral studies
- 3. Outcomes research and health services research

Note: The NIH exclusion of studies falling under 45 CFR 46.101(b) (4) (Exemption 4) is not applicable for the CE waiver criteria. (research with existing data or patient records).

# **5-day Internal Proposal Deadline**

- 5 business days in advance of the sponsor deadline
  - Complete proposal package (scope of work can be draft)
  - Internal budget and budget justification approved by PI and RPM
  - Applicable waivers approved by RMG
  - Subaward budget(s) and budget justification(s)
- 3 business days in advance of deadline
  - Complete and final proposal ready for submission
  - PDRF approved in SeRA

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Start early!

• FARA-Friedreich's Ataxia Research Alliance

**General Research Grant** 

\$150K/yr for 1-2 yrs

See the guidelines for the grant program priorities

**Eligibility:** faculty with PI eligibility and CE Faculty (with an approved CE faculty PI waiver obtained through their RPM at least 1 week prior to the LOI deadline)

Additional Research Grant Subtype: Postdoctoral Trainee and Ph.D. Students (PI= faculty member) No citizenship restriction

Letter of intent (required): Feb. 1, 2017

Institutional representative (RPM/RMG or OSR) deadline: March 24, 2017

Full proposal (by invitation only): April 1, 2017
