Requirements for California Licensure:

Each applicant for licensure in California as a physician and surgeon shall document that he or she has successfully completed an allopathic medical curriculum in a medical school or schools which extended over a period of at least four (4) academic years totaling thirty-six months (36) months of instruction.

Please be advised that it can take 6-8 months to obtain your license.

Each applicant shall have completed a minimum of seventy-two (72) weeks of clinical rotations, including core rotations, at an institution which:

- 1) Sponsors the rotation and is a formal part (primary hospital) of the medical school; or
- 2) Has formal affiliation with a medical school approved by the Division of Licensing; or
- 3) Has a postgraduate training program approved by the Division of Licensing in the clinical area for which credit is being sought, except that clinical training in the areas of surgery, medicine, pediatrics, obstetrics and gynecology and psychiatry may be obtained in an institution with a postgraduate training program in family practice.

Core clinical rotations are:

Surgery	12 weeks; or a minimum of 8 weeks of general surgery and 4 weeks of a surgical subspecialty
Internal Medicine	8 weeks
Pediatrics	6 weeks
Obstetrics and Gynecology	6 weeks
Psychiatry	4 weeks
