




Go Pass and Eco Passes Distributed

Brodie negotiated an agreement with Caltrain to establish the University Pass, the U-Pass, at Stanford, which expanded to other employers and became the Go Pass.

Brodie should be recognized for the role he had in the creation of the Caltrain Go Pass, which was first the University Pass just for Stanford. His passion for public transit has led to more university faculty and staff, as well as hospital employees, riding Caltrain.
