PALO ALTO, Calif. – April 24, 2006 – The Palo Alto Art Center (PAAC) and the Palo Alto Unified School District (PAUSD) will again collaborate and celebrate the imaginative spirit of students K-12 by hosting the *Youth Art Exhibition* from May 14-June 4, 2006. This annual exhibition highlights the creative and artistic output of students that participate in visual arts education programs within the PAUSD. It features instructor-selected work that demonstrates artistic accomplishment and innovation in the classroom. A component of these programs is the Spectra Art program that provides elementary school students with experiences that explore a wide variety of media, artists and artistic processes. The companion exhibition, *Cultural Kaleidoscope*, is an arts education program of the Palo Alto Art Center Foundation (PAACF). This artist-in-residency program partners K-5 classes from schools in the PAUSD and the Ravenswood School District. Its goal is to deepen students' awareness of diverse cultures through the creation of independent and collaborative art projects.

A free public opening reception with the student artists will be held at the Palo Alto Art Center on May 17, 2006, from 6:00-8:00 p.m. The opening reception will include an awards presentation at 6:30 p.m.: Palo Alto Art Center Foundation Graduating Senior Awards and Public Art Commission Purchase Awards. Additional reception events include hands-on workshops (pre-registration required) presented by studio supervisors at the Art Center, and a hands-on Claymation activity presented by the Center's Project LOOK! program.

"We are delighted to again co-sponsor *Youth Art* with the Palo Alto Unified School District as part of a community partnership that has continued for over 20 years," stated Linda Craighead, Executive Director of the Palo Alto Art Center. "The high-caliber of the student work created for both *Youth Art* and *Cultural Kaleidoscope* is not only a reflection of the school district's commitment to providing quality art programs in the schools, it underscores the enriching cultural benefit of arts education to the entire community," she added.
