NEWS AND NOTES Postseasons of Years Past

• Under head coach Tara Danielson, the Cardinal have gone to the NCAA Tournament five out of her six seasons at the helm for postseason record of 1-4.

Dancing with the Devil

• The Cardinal have faced off with Duke before, topping them 3-2 in OT in the second game of the season. The Blue Devils lead the all-time series between the two schools, 4-1, and are 1-0 against Stanford in NCAA Tournament contests with a first round victory over the Cardinal in 2011.

Close Quarters

• Of the Cardinal's 19 games this season, 14 have been decided by one goal - six in overtime.

Leading the Way

• Reigning America East Offensive Player of the Year, Maddie Secco leads the Cardinal in goals (8), assists (13) and points (29), while Fran Tew leads the team in shots (43). Secco, Sarah Hegelson, Clemence Couteau and Jessica Chisholm have all netted two game winning goals as well. America East Goalkeeper of the Year, Dulcie Davies, has made 91 saves and ranks 3rd in the nation with an .798 save percentage and 8th with a 1.20 goals against average.

When head coach Tara Danielson first arrived on The Farm, Stanford was considered to be one of the country's fast-rising programs.

Six years later, Danielson has continued to elevate the program's national standing in the form of both team and individual success.

In addition to making five of the past six NCAA Tournaments, Stanford has remained a fixture in the national rankings for all but one week during Danielson's tenure.

In 2014, Danielson led Stanford to new heights, including program records in wins (19), winning-streak (12) and national ranking (No. 3). Perhaps most noteworthy was the Cardinal's first-ever NCAA Tournament victory, a 2-1 thriller over No. 10 Louisville.

Stanford finished the 2013 season with a 16-5 record, winning 15 games for the fifth consecutive season. The Cardinal earned its fifth straight NorPac West regular season title and appeared in its eighth consecutive NorPac Championship final

Stanford wrapped up the 2012 campaign at 16-7 overall, reaching the NCAA Tournament while capturing the NorPac Championship for the fifth time in six years. Perhaps even more impressive, the Cardinal navigated through a grueling non-conference schedule in which it played four games against the nation's No. 1-ranked team at the time.

Danielson's 2011 squad (17-4, 6-0 NorPac) tied a school record for victories, reached its highest-ever national ranking at No. 6 and sported a top-10 RPI for the entire season. Boasting six top-20 victories, the Cardinal earned an at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history.

Stanford's winningest first-year head coach, Danielson led Stanford to a 15-6 overall record in 2010, with the 15 victories ranking as the thirdmost in school history. Danielson's debut season resulted in Stanford's 10th NCAA Tournament appearance and third postseason trip in four years.

Stanford has also excelled academically under Danielson, including a school-record 18 players named to the SGI/NFHCA Division I National Academic Squad in 2012. The Cardinal has been honored with at least 10 selections in 10 of the past 12 seasons.

Danielson was announced as Stanford's sixth head coach on July 13, 2010. In addition to enjoying an extensive international playing career, Danielson has developed a reputation as a pioneer through her efforts on the developmental level while implementing several successful outreach programs.
