- Based on current best practices, assess the adolescent with depression and treat or refer appropriately
- Apply the latest advances and best practices in the evaluation, treatment and
- referral of a child with abdominal pain, cardiac murmur, headache or eye conditions • Differentiate between worrisome and benign urologic conditions in the child
- Develop a plan for responding to a clinical emergency in the office.
