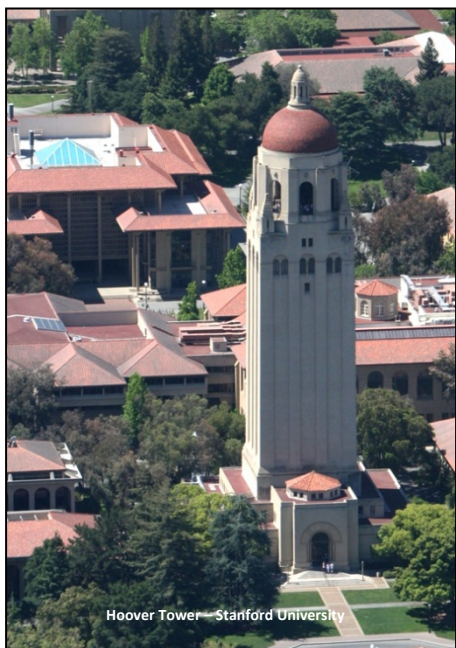

The Division of Oncology in the Department of Medicine at Stanford University is recruiting a **head and neck medical oncologist**. The faculty position is at the Assistant Professor, Associate Professor, or Professor level in either the University Tenure Line (UTL) or Medical Center Line (MCL). The successful candidate should be an accomplished clinical or laboratory investigator with a demonstrated record of research funding and publication in leading cancer journals, and he/she will have experience in multimodality patient care. Faculty rank will be determined by the qualifications and experience of the successful candidate.

The predominant criterion for appointment in the UTL is a major commitment to research and teaching. The major criteria for appointment for faculty in the MCL shall be excellence in the overall mix of clinical care, clinical teaching, scholarly activity that advances clinical medicine, and institutional service—appropriate to the programmatic need the individual is expected to fulfill.

The Stanford Head and Neck Oncology Program (HNOP) has a history of accomplishment in multidisciplinary investigational treatment for head and neck cancer, especially nasopharyngeal and oropharyngeal cancers. The Stanford HNOP is closely aligned with the developmental therapeutics and immunotherapy program of the Stanford Cancer Institute, benefitting from numerous active collaborations with basic science and translational medicine programs at the University. We seek a medical oncologist to help develop our clinical and research programs, with major growth anticipated in thyroid, salivary gland and base of skull malignancy. The successful candidate will be expected to build an academic Head and Neck Oncology research program with a clinical/translational research focus, teach fellows, and participate in the Head and Neck Oncology clinics. Candidates must have an MD and be board certified or eligible in Oncology and/or Hematology.
