Candidates should have an MD or MD/PhD and be board certified or eligible in Oncology and/or Hematology. The candidate should have a record of accomplishment in clinical care, teaching, and a focused area of interest and expertise in lymphoma.


The major criteria for appointment for faculty in the Medical Center Line shall be excellence in the overall mix of clinical care, clinical teaching, scholarly activity that advances clinical medicine, and institutional service appropriate to the programmatic need the individual is expected to fulfill. Faculty rank will be determined by the qualifications and experience of the successful candidate.

It is expected that the successful applicant will develop an academic lymphoma research program in either translational clinical research or outcomes/survivorship research. Competitive salary support, and startup funds are available for this position. Candidates will be preferred who have demonstrated the ability or shown the potential to obtain peer reviewed research funding. Collaborations with colleagues in related clinical and basic science disciplines are important aspects of this position.
