An Undergraduate Student is either a Degree-Seeking Student pursuing an Undergraduate Degree, or a Non-Degree-Seeking Student who has not yet earned a Bachelor's Degree.	Coterminal	Graduate Student: A Graduate Student is a student who is engaged in a program of study or training at the postbaccalaureate level. A Graduate Student is either a Degree-Seeking Student pursuing a Graduate Degree, or a Non-Degree-Seeking Student who has already earned a Bachelor's Degree.	Degree-Seeking Student: A Degree-
