 - Formal, provides structure, training, tools, selected group of faculty mentors who are specialists in specific areas: Clinical/Teaching, Research, Work/Life Balance, and Academic
- Mentoring Workshops, Networks, and Consultation Organized by VPFDD, for all faculty
 - **Faculty Scholars (Associate Professors)**
 - Peer/cohort-based
 - Structured activities
 - **Lessons Learned Lunches**
 - Topics: lab management, working with mentors, strategies to prepare for tenure
 - Peer and near-peer mentoring
 - Management and Leadership Skills Workshops
 - Topics: communication, media, negotiation, and mentoring
 - **Individual Faculty Coaching**
