The Stanford University School of Medicine is conducting an open rank search to recruit a faculty member with an interest in biobanking and the use of biobanked samples in population research primarily related to identification and characterization of genetic human traits and risk for human disease, in the University Tenure Line, Medical Center Line, or Non-Tenure Aline (Research).

The predominant criterion for appointment in the University Tenure Line is a major commitment to research and teaching. The major criteria for appointment for faculty in the Medical Center Line shall be excellence in the overall mix of clinical care, teaching and scholarly activity that advances clinical medicine. The major criterion for appointment for faculty in the Non-Tenure Line (Research) is evidence of high-level performance as a researcher for whose special knowledge a programmatic need exists.

Faculty rank will be determined by the qualifications and experience of the successful candidate.

The applicant will have an M.D., Ph.D., or combined M.D.-Ph.D degree and have interest and experience in the recruitment of subjects in the hospital and out-patient setting, appropriate methods for the processing and archiving of such samples for genetic studies, and the use of relational databases to house phenotypic and genotypic data related to these subjects.

Their area of research will be driven by scientific and possibly clinical interests, and the applicant is expected to develop an independently funded research effort employing modern genetic methods. They will also be expected to help with teaching activities in their Department and the School of Medicine, and contribute to the clinical mission if applicable. Scientific and clinical interests and appropriateness of fit will determine the Department to which the candidate will be recruited. Appropriate resources will be made available to help the applicant develop their research program.
