Scope & Need




Project Scope

- Remove and replace three existing vehicular/pedestrian bridges over the Caltrain tracks at the following locations:
 - 22nd Street
 - 23rd Street
 - Paul Avenue

Replace Three Vehicular/Pedestrian Bridges



Project Need

Why do these bridges need to be replaced?

- Rapidly aging vehicular/pedestrian bridges
- Bridges deemed structurally deficient; do not meet existing seismic safety standards
- Must be replaced for the safety and well-being of community members and Caltrain customers



Background

- Project cost: \$17- \$20 million
- Paid for by Caltrans
- Owned by the City of San Francisco
- Maintained by Caltrain



Project Elements, Timeline & Impacts




Project Elements

- Retrofit existing abutments to support new structures
- Utility relocations
- Temporary street closures
- Demolition/construction
- Paving and street improvements




Typical Removal Plan

Timeline

- Contract Awarded in December 2014 to Disney Construction Inc.
- Street Closures:
 - 23rd Street: May 2015 to Jan 2016
 - Paul Ave: Jun 2015 to Aug 2016
 - 22nd Street: Jan 2016 to Oct 2016
- Demolition:
 - -23rd Street: Start Jun 2015
 - Paul Ave: Start Sep 2015
 - 22nd Street: Start Feb 2016



Construction Impacts

- Majority of work done during day
- Some night and weekend work required during certain construction activities
 - Weekend Work Windows from Friday at 08:00pm to Monday 05:00am
 - At least two Weekend Work Windows per bridge
 - Weekend Work Windows will be used only when necessary
- Localized noise impacts

Scope & Need

Caltrain will remove and replace the existing vehicular/pedestrian bridges over the Caltrain tracks at 22nd Street, 23rd Street, and Paul Avenue in San Francisco. Existing abutments will also be retrofitted to support the new structure. Utilities supported by the bridges will be temporarily relocated during bridge removal and construction.

The three bridges are deemed structurally deficient, do not meet existing seismic safety standard and must be replaced to ensure the safety and wellbeing of community members and Caltrain passengers.
