TELEVISION SCHEDULE

Pac-12 Baseball, responsible for the last two national titles and four of the last eight, will enjoy increased and unprecedented exposure in the upcoming season as a record 74 games will be televised in 2014, more than double what was broadcast a year ago. That number includes 70 games broadcast by the Pac-12 Networks and four on ESPN channels.

Stanford will take part in 13 of the 74 total broadcasts for the conference, including its home opener Feb. 14 against Rice. The Cardinal will play 12 games on Pac-12 Networks and another on ESPNU throughout the season.

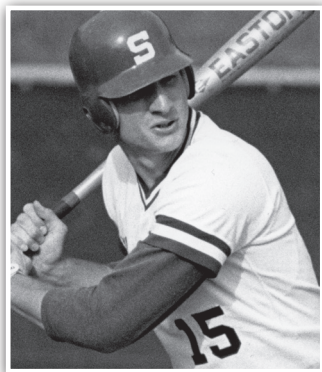

1987 CHAMPIONS

The 1987 season went down in the record books as one of the finest in Stanford's storied baseball history.

Not only did the Cardinal set a then-school record with 53 wins and capture the Pacific-10 Conference Southern Division by five full games, but under then 11th-year head coach Mark Marquess, Stanford finally captured the ultimate prize – the College World Series championship.

"Winning the national championship was an experience no one on our team will ever forget," said Marquess. "To realize the dream of being champions is a very special feeling. It's something that stays with you forever."

Stanford swept all four games in the NCAA West Regional to advance to Omaha, where it won five of six contests. In the title game against Oklahoma State, the Cardinal pounded the top-ranked Cowboys for nine runs on 15 hits to back the pitching of All-American Jack McDowell.

The Cardinal jumped out to an early 2-0 lead in the first inning against the Cowboys. With one out, Toi Cook singled, stole second and went to third on a single by Ed Sprague. Paul Carey's infield out allowed Cook to score the first run of the game. Sprague came home with two outs when David Esquer lined a single up the middle.

Oklahoma State bounced back with a single run in the third and two more in the fourth to take a 3-2 advantage. But, as was the case the entire CWS, the Cardinal stormed back immediately to regain the lead.

In the fifth, Ruben Amaro, Jr. walked and went to third on Cook's double. A wild pitch by OSU starter Pat Hope allowed Amaro to score and pushed Cook to third. Sprague's sacrifice fly brought in Cook and put the Cardinal on top, 4-3. Back-to-back doubles by Carey and Ron Witmeyer made the score 5-3. It was 6-3 after Esquer's bunt single drove home Witmeyer.

The Cowboys scored a single run in the fifth to pull within 6-4, where the score remained until the ninth.

In the eighth, however, Oklahoma State had two runners on with no outs and the bases loaded with two out, but came away empty. McDowell walked the first two batters of the inning, then gave way to Steve Chitren, who did his impression of the heartbreak kid.

Chitren proceeded to strike out Benny Castillo and Brad Beanblossom before hitting Anthony Blackmon with a pitch to load the bases. The Cardinal relief ace then completed the hat trick by striking out Ray Ortiz to end the threat.

Stanford increased its lead to 9-4 by scoring three times in the ninth. Cook and Sprague led off the inning with singles. Carey, who would later be named the Series' Most Outstanding Player, doubled home Cook. Sprague scored

later in the inning on a passed ball and Carey picked up the final run on an infield out by Doug Robbins.

Chitren allowed a run in the ninth, but it didn't matter much. The Cardinal held on to record the first national baseball championship in school history.

"I'm numb," said Carey following the title game. "My head's spinning, and I feel like I'm up in the air right now. There were a few times when I got nervous, when we were in the field and the other team was scoring. But when we were at bat, I knew we could do it."

In order to reach the championship game, Stanford needed to overcome some hurdles and receive a few miracles. The club did both.

The Cardinal's 3-2 opening win over Georgia was marred by two rain delays, which included playing the final three innings the following day. McDowell and Chitren outdueled First Team All-American Derek Lilliquist and Cris Carpenter to give Stanford the win.

Stanford won its second straight game to open the CWS with a 6-1 victory over Texas but a 6-2 loss to Oklahoma State in its third contest put the Cardinal a game away from elimination. That's when the miracle occurred – a game that will forever stand out in Stanford Baseball history.

The Cardinal trailed LSU, 5-2, in the bottom of the 10th inning and was headed for home when it struck. With one out, Amaro and Cook walked, and Sprague was hit by a pitch to load the bases. Carey then stepped up to the plate and hit a Ben McDonald fastball over the left field wall for a game-winning grand slam and a 6-5 victory.

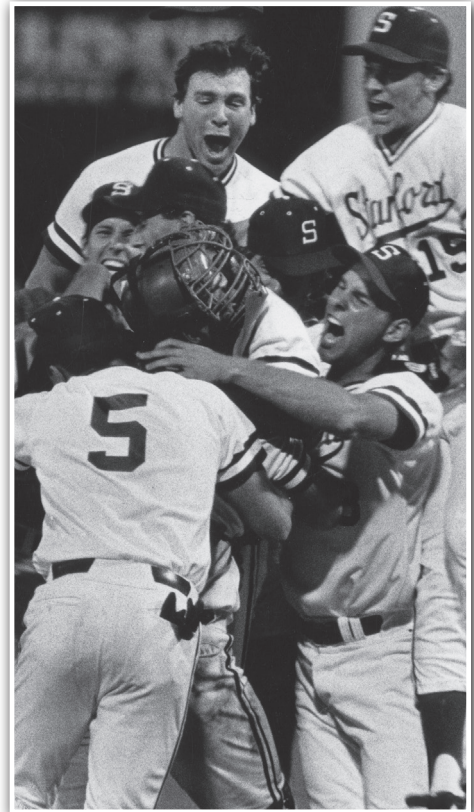
The next day, the Cardinal trailed Texas, 3-0, in the first inning. But, relief pitcher Al Osuna closed the door on the Longhorns over the final 8.2 innings as Stanford came from behind for a 9-3 win, putting the club in the championship game against No. 1 ranked Oklahoma State.

The offensive heroes of the 1987 CWS proved to be Carey (.381, 7 RBI), Mark Machtolf (.429), Esquer (.350, 6 RBI) and Witmeyer (.409). Osuna, Brian Keyser (1.80 ERA), Lee Plemel (1-0, 2.89 ERA), Chitren (1-0, 2 SV) and McDowell led a pitching staff that compiled a 2.94 ERA in 55.0 innings.

Carey, Esquer and Machtolf were named to the All-College World Series team.

"It was unbelievable," said Marquess. "I can't describe the feeling of winning the national championship."

1988 CHAMPIONS

Stanford made history in 1988 by becoming just the third team in college baseball history to capture back-to-back national championships. The Cardinal, which entered the College World Series seeded seventh, beat Pac-10 rival Arizona State, 9-4, in a game nationally-televised by CBS.

Not only was the second straight title unprecedented, but it also came as an unexpected prize to Cardinal mentor Mark Marquess.

"I honestly didn't think it was possible for us or any other team to win back-to-back championships," he said. "In this day of scholarship limitations and the parity of college baseball, I just didn't think it could happen. It is truly an amazing feat for us to repeat."

In a season that saw Stanford play inconsistently at times, the Cardinal managed to put it all together in Omaha to keep the championship trophy on The Farm.

In order to get to the title game for a second straight year, Stanford had to beat Fresno State (10-3, June 4), Miami (2-1, June 7) and Cal State Fullerton twice (4-1, June 9; 9-5, June 10) before meeting up with the Sun Devils. The Cardinal lost its second game of the CWS to Cal State Fullerton (5-3, June 6), before going on to win its final four contests en route to the championship.

Stanford, backed by a 13-hit attack and the pitching of freshman Stan Spencer and junior Steve Chitren, beat an Arizona State team in the title game that had won five-of-six contests from Stanford during the regular season. The Cardinal jumped on Sun Devil starter Rusty Kilgo for five first inning runs and led 8-0 after three innings.

In the first, Frank Carey led off with a single and, one out later, scored on Ed Sprague's 22nd home run of the season. Paul Carey then singled and Doug Robbins walked, putting runners on first and second. Ron Witmeyer's RBI single sent Paul Carey home for the third run of the inning. It also spelled a quick exit for Kilgo.

Brian Johnson greeted new ASU pitcher Blas Minor with a blast of his own, a two-run double off the left field wall. The Sun Devils, who handled Stanford very easily during the regular season, were suddenly looking uphill at a 5-0 deficit.

The Cardinal onslaught continued in the second frame when Frank Carey led off with a single and advanced to third on a single by Troy Paulsen. Linty Ingram replaced Minor on the mound and with one out Paul Carey's sacrifice fly to center scored Frank Carey, putting Stanford on top, 6-0.

The score reached 8-0 in the third after Tim Griffin singled home Witmeyer and later scored on a wild pitch by Ingram.

Meanwhile, Spencer was working on a gem, limiting one of the top offenses in the country to just one run on six hits through six innings. Staked to the early lead, Spencer was able to pitch his type of game.

"I just wanted to come in and throw strikes, spot the fastball and go right at them," he said. "Once you've got a lead you don't want to walk anybody. You want to make them hit you."

Spencer lasted seven innings before giving way to Chitren, who became the first pitcher in college baseball history to record the final out in two consecutive championship games. Chitren worked the final two innings, allowing no runs on one hit.

Stanford's second College World Series championship took the college baseball world by surprise. The Cardinal accomplished what few thought they could.

"No one thought we would come back for a second title," said Witmeyer. "So this one's probably more satisfying than the first one. Everyone said we couldn't do it."

"It was harder for us during the season to win games," said senior Lee Plemel. "At the end of the year, however, I think we knew we could win."

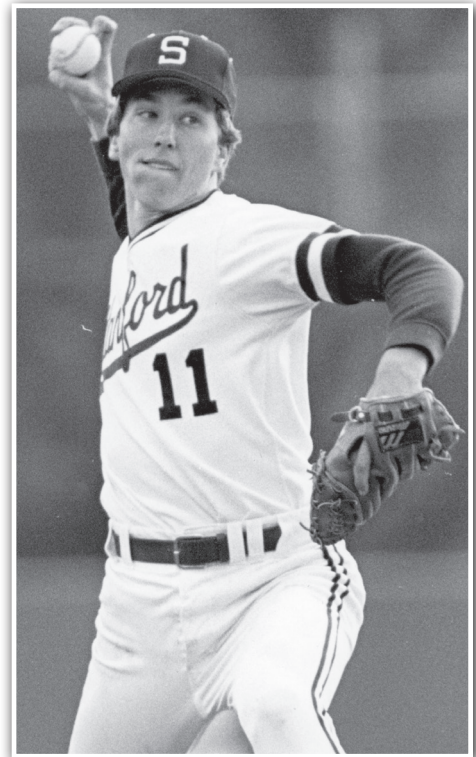
Plemel received College World Series MVP honors after recording two complete game wins over Fresno State and Cal State Fullerton, allowing just four earned runs in 18.0 innings of work. Witmeyer and Robbins were also named to the All-CWS team. Witmeyer led Stanford in hitting during the CWS with a .400 average while Robbins drove in five runs and played superb defense.

The other mainstays on the club included a pitching staff that compiled an impressive 2.38 ERA in 53.0 innings of work at the CWS. Plemel, Chitren (8.1 innings, no earned runs), Spencer (1-0, 2.63 ERA), Brian Keyser (1-0, 3.38 ERA) and Mike Mussina led the way on the hill. Sprague, who was chosen in the first round of the 1988 MLB First-Year Player Draft, hit three home runs in the Series and drove in a team-leading six runs while Griffin batted .316.

Paulsen (shortstop), second baseman Frank Carey and centerfielder Eric DeGraw led a defense that proved to be one of the best in all of college baseball.

"There were times during the year where we could have quit," said Marquess, "But, we just kept telling ourselves to keep working hard and maybe something good will happen - and it did. It happened at the right time."
