### COMING UP

Freshman Tabitha Yim will travel to Auburn, Alabama to participate in the NCAA Championship as an individual competitor this week. Yim qualified for the NCAA Championship after finishing fifth in the all-around at the West Regional in Seattle on April 9th to earn one of the two automatic berths to the NCAA's reserved for individuals on non-automatic qualifying teams. Yim enters the NCAA Championship as the highest scoring all-around performer among the at-large individual competitors going into nationals, having posted a 39.250 mark at the West Regional.

### YIM TO CLOSE OUT OUTSTANDING YEAR AT NCAA'S

Tabitha Yim competed in the all-around for the first time this season at the West Regional on April 9th, and placed fifth with a 39.250 score to qualify for the NCAA Championship as an individual competitor. Yim, a 2004 Olympic Trials participant, has rebounded from an injury to her Achilles to post an outstanding freshman campaign. The Irvine, CA native did not compete in Stanford's first two meets of the season, and made her debut on bars and beam at Central Michigan on February 4th. Yim added the floor exercise to her repertoire the following week at Arizona and competed on vault for the first time this season at the West Regional, scoring a 9.750.

Yim's strongest event is the uneven bars, where she helped the Cardinal to a No. 11 national team ranking heading into post-season competition. Entering the West Regional, Yim ranked seventh in the nation on bars with a 9.900 Regional Qualifying Score (RQS). She currently has a 9.892 season average, and posted a personal season-high 9.925 score on bars at Arizona, which is tied for the third best score posted by a Stanford gymnast this season.

Yim has also excelled on the balance beam, where she has averaged a 9.772 score. She set a team season-high with a 9.925 score on beam at San Jose State on March 19th, and has received 9.875 marks twice this season.

### NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP SCHEDULE

Tabitha Yim will compete on Thursday, April 21st in the team preliminaries, rotating with the University of Nebraska's squad. The group will compete in Olympic order, beginning the meet on vault in the first rotation. After a bye, the group will move on to the uneven bars and balance beam, before resting with a bye in the fifth rotation and wrapping up competition on the floor exercise in the sixth rotation. The gymnasts that post the top four scores in each of the four events in the first session will advance to the event finals, scheduled for Saturday at 7:00 pm.

### WEST REGIONAL WRAP UP

The Stanford women's gymnastics team fell short in its bid for a fifth straight NCAA Championship appearance, scoring a 194.750 to finish fourth at the NCAA West Regional in Seattle on April 9th. UCLA captured the top spot with a 197.025 score, and Penn State finished in second place with a 195.375 to advance to the NCAA Championship. Stanford's 194.750 mark fell just short of host Washington's 195.000 team score, as the Huskies captured third place. Rounding out the field at the West Regional was Boise State in fifth place with a 194.500 score and Central Michigan in sixth place with a 194.125 team mark.

The Cardinal proceeded in Olympic order throughout the six-team meet, beginning on vault in the first rotation. The squad registered a team score of 48.225, with junior Natalie Foley and Yim each scoring a 9.750 to lead the team. Following a bye in the second rotation, the Cardinal competed on the uneven bars in the third rotation. Yim scored a team-high 9.875, and Foley chipped in with a 9.800 as the team registered a 48.750 team mark.

The squad excelled on the balance beam in rotation four, posting a season-high team score of 49.000, thanks in large part to freshman Lauren Elmore's personal season-high 9.900 score that tied for third place. Yim and Foley also contributed to the team score with identical 9.800 marks. Stanford headed into the floor exercise in the final rotation within striking distance of the top two spots. Yim continued to impress, tying a personal season-high with a 9.825 to capture fifth place in the event. Elmore contributed to the team mark with a 9.775 score, but the Cardinal could only muster a 48.775 team total on floor.

Due to injuries, only seven different gymnasts competed for the Cardinal at the West Regional, and five of them competed in the all-around. Yim competed in the all-around for the first time this season, and scored a 39.250 to finish fifth overall. Foley scored a 39.025 in the all-around to place eighth, while Pintchouk finished ninth with a personal season-high score of 38.950. Elmore placed 11th with a 38.875 and Precourt competed in the all-around for the first time this season, scoring a 38.525 to finish 17th.

### FOLEY AND YIM NAMED ALL-PAC-10

Junior **Natalie Foley** and freshman **Tabitha Yim** were named to the Pac-10 All-Conference Team as announced by the conference office last Wednesday. Foley, who earned three all-conference honors last season, was named to the Pac-10 All-Conference Team in the all-around, while Yim received All-Pac-10 accolades on the uneven bars. Foley has competed in the all-around in each of the Cardinal's last seven meets, posting a personal season-high score of 39.250 at the Utah Quad on March 4th. Yim received All-Pac-10 honors for the first time after establishing herself as one of the top performers in the nation on bars with a 9.900 Regional Qualifying Score (RQS) ... UCLA led all Pac-10 teams with 13 selections, while Stanford and Arizona State had two and Arizona received one ... The All-Conference team consists of the top-six all-around competitors, plus the top three competitors in each individual event. A gymnast's score is determined by a combination of 50 percent RQS (entire season composite) and 50 percent Pac-10 Championship score.

### FRESHMAN CLASS AMONG NATION'S ELITE

Coach Smyth welcomes a highly-touted six-member freshman class to The Farm for the 2005 season. The group was recently ranked as the nation's second best recruiting class by Collegegymfans.com, being narrowly edged out by Georgia's incoming group. Headlining the incoming class is a pair of gymnasts that competed at the U.S. Olympic Trials last summer. **Liz Tricase (Itasca, IL)** will jump right into the Cardinal lineup as an all-around performer, while **Tabitha Yim (Irvine, CA)** continues to rebound from an injury and will be ready to compete early in the season. **Stephanie Gentry (Plano, TX)** joins the squad after competing in the Junior Olympic Nationals twice, and participating as a member of the National Team from 2000-2001. **Lauren Elmore (Bloomington, IN)** is a five-time Junior Olympic Nationals Competitor, a former Junior Olympic National all-around champion (2003), and will contribute immediately on a number of events. **Alex Pintchouk (Mt. Laurel, NJ)** is a two-time Level 10 New Jersey state champion, and competed for Will-Moor Gymnastics. **Aimee Precourt (Pasadena, TX)** is a two-time Junior Olympic Nationals competitor, and captured the Texas State all-around championship in 2004.

## THE SMYTH FILE



**Kristen Smyth** returns for her fourth year as Stanford women's gymnastics head coach, following an incredible 2004 campaign that saw her sweep the annual coaching awards, garnering Pac-10, West Region, and NACGC National Coach of the Year honors.

During her time at Stanford, Smyth has quickly turned the Cardinal program into one of the nation's elite. Smyth came to The Farm in June of 2001 and in her first season, led Stanford to its first-ever NCAA Super Six appearance. She followed that up with another NCAA Championship appearance in 2003, marking the third straight year that the Cardinal advanced to the NCAA Championships. Last season she guided Stanford gymnastics to its fourth straight NCAA Championships, and capped the most successful season in program history by tying for third at the NCAA Super Six Championships.

The 2004 Stanford gymnastics squad put together an amazing campaign, capturing the Pac-10 title as well as a championship at the North Central Regional. The Cardinal garnered 15 All-American awards in 2004, eclipsing the previous season's program-high of eight. The team also posted a national season-high score with a 198.875 against California on February 20, and set national event season-high scores on floor (49.925) and beam (49.750).

In 2003, Smyth and the Cardinal turned in another outstanding performance at the NCAA Championships, coming within 0.425 of a point from advancing to their second straight NCAA Super Six. The Cardinal earned eight All-American honors, garnering two first team honors and six second team accolades. The Cardinal finished the season with a 20-4-1 overall record and a No. 6 final national ranking.

En route to the Super Six in 2002, the Cardinal ended the regular season at 13-5 overall and captured first place honors at the NCAA North Central Regional Championships after defeating perennial powerhouse Georgia for the first time. Smyth coached two Pacific-10 Champions on beam and the conference's co-Freshman of the Year, Mandy Delgado. The Cardinal also boasted four regional champions and three athletes who competed in the NCAA Individual Event Finals. Earning First Team All-American honors were Kendall Beck on vault and Lise Léveillé and Lindsay Wing on beam.

Recruiting is an area where the Cardinal program has continued to excel. When recruiting future student-athletes, Smyth stresses well-rounded, balanced athletes that excel in the classroom and the community, as well as on the competition floor. In her first year at Stanford, she signed one of the top recruiting classes in the country in Natalie Foley, Jessica Louie and Glyn Sweets, and followed that up with another solid recruiting class in Brittany Billmaier, Erin Geary, and Stacy Sprando in 2003. This season, the Stanford program welcomes another highly rated recruiting class to The Farm. Joining the Cardinal this season will be Lauren Elmore, Stephanie Gentry, Alex Pincthok, Aimee Precourt, Elizabeth Tricase, and Tabitha Yim.

Her team also ranks among the leaders in the classroom and the community. Last year, nine Stanford gymnasts earned 2004 National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches (NACGC) Academic All-American honors, and ranked seventh in the nation with a team grade point average of 3.510. In 2003, the team boasted six NACGC Academic All-Americans, following a 2002 season in which Stanford ranked eighth in the country with a team grade point average of 3.467 and put eight student-athletes on the Academic All-America Team. The 2002 squad also earned the Stanford Athletic Board's Thomas W. Ford, presented to the team whose student-athletes have demonstrated a special commitment to participation in community outreach programs.

Smyth came to The Farm after previously serving as the associate head coach at Arizona State. Smyth came to Tempe as an assistant coach prior to the 1997 season, and was promoted to associate head coach in 2000. She was named the 1998 Regional Assistant Coach of the Year after helping the Sun Devils to a sixth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. During her tenure, Arizona State advanced to the NCAA Super Six in three of her five seasons.

While at Arizona State, she enjoyed tremendous success coaching the Sun Devil floor exercise and balance beam artists. She led Sun Devils gymnasts to seven All-American honors in the floor and five All-American honors and one NCAA Individual Championship (Elizabeth Reid in 1997) in the beam. In addition to her responsibilities with the Sun Devils, Smyth was president of the Lady Devil Gymnastics Camp, which is an elite summer program for girls from the ages of 5-17. Prior to her arrival at Arizona State, Smyth danced professionally for three years in the San Francisco Bay Area.

In the collegiate athletic arena, Smyth is one of the top gymnasts in both Pacific-10 Conference and University of California history. A 1993 graduate of California, Smyth was named the Golden Bears' Gymnast of the Decade, and was a nominee for Pacific-10 Conference Gymnast of the Decade honors. She was both a three-time All-American and three-time Academic All-American, and guided the Golden Bears to its first-ever NCAA Championship berth in 1992.

Smyth and her husband Scott Green have a daughter named Maya and the couple resides in Mountain View.
