Looking Back

Stanford wrapped up the 2007 campaign at 24-2 overall and 8-0 in Pac-10 play, securing the 20th league title in school history. The Cardinal was undefeated in the previous three seasons (86-0) and strung together an NCAA record 89-match winning streak until a 4-3 loss to then-No. 6 Georgia Tech back on Feb. 3 at the National Team Indoor Championships. Ranked as low as No. 4 this year (Mar. 6), the Cardinal bounced back and retained the No. 1 spot since late March. Not to mention Stanford went almost three months without its normal lineup in tact as key starters battled through multiple injuries and slow starts.

Stanford All-Time In NCAA Tournament

Stanford owns a 104-12 record in the postseason since the NCAA Tournament went to its present format in 1982. During that time, Stanford has won 15 of 26 possible NCAA team titles, including three of the last four seasons. Prior to a 4-2 setback against UCLA in the NCAA semifinals on May 21, the Cardinal owned a 22-match winning streak in NCAA Tournament play dating back to its last loss against Florida in the 2003 national championship. Stanford has now qualified for the semifinals in 25 of the 26 NCAA Championships.

Home Sweet Home

Stanford closed out the regular season home schedule with a perfect 12-0 record, extending its winning streak to 95 in such matches. Throw in a 26-0 record in NCAA Tournament matches played at Taube Family Tennis Stadium and Stanford has not been defeated in the last 121 contests played on its home court. Stanford's last loss at the Taube Family Tennis Stadium occurred on Feb. 27, 1999, when No. 4 California pulled a 5-4 upset.

A 1-0 Lead Certainly Helps

Stanford captured the doubles point in 22 of its 26 matches so far this year, translating into a quick 1-0 lead. That includes eight doubles sweeps, the last coming on Apr. 7 against Washington when all three teams won by identical 8-2 margins.

The Forood File

Head coach Lele Forood, the 2003 Wilson/ITA National Coach of the Year and three-time Pac-10 Coach of the Year, is in her seventh year at the helm of the Cardinal. Last year, Forood captured her fifth NCAA team title in six years and the 15th NCAA Championship in school history. After serving as an assistant and associate head coach at Stanford for 13 years, Forood has guided the Cardinal to an unthinkable 192-5 overall record with seven Pac-10 titles.

Returning to the court for the first time in almost two weeks, No. 1 Stanford defeated No. 5 USC 5-2 on Friday afternoon in the Pac-10 opener for both teams.

The Cardinal (4-1) won the doubles point for the fourth time in five matches this year. After winning the doubles point, USC knotted the match at 1-1 following Lindsey Nelson's 6-3, 6-4 upset of No. 89 Theresa Logar at the No. 1 position.

No. 13 Celia Durkin's 6-3, 6-2 win at the No. 2 spot put Stanford back up 2-1 in the match until USC's Sarah Fansler knocked off Anne Yelsey 6-4, 6-4 at No. 2 to tie the match at 2-2.

Wins at the bottom four spots, including No. 8 Jessica Nguyen's 6-3, 1-6, 6-2 clincher at the No. 4 position, iced Stanford's fourth win of the year.

Anne Yelsey and Lindsay Burdette recorded wins at the Nos. 2 and 6 singles spots to give the top-ranked Cardinal a come-from-behind win over No. 15 UCLA, 4-3, today at the Taube Tennis Center.

Stanford, now 5-1 overall, trailed 3-2 with two singles matches remaining, leaving the match in the hands of Yelsey and Burdette.

Yelsey defeated the Bruin's No. 61 Tracy Lin 6-2, 6-7, 7-6 while Burdette won at No. 6 singles by defeating UCLA's Elizabeth Lumpkin, 2-6, 7-6, 6-1. Stanford took a 1-0 lead after doubles play, but the Bruins recorded wins at No. 1, No. 3 and No. 5 singles to take the lead.

At No. 1 singles, Stanford's Theresa Logar was beaten by UCLA's Riza Zalameda, 1-6, 6-1, 6-0. Stanford's other victory in singles came at No. 4 when Jessica Nguyen handed UCLA's Ashley Joelson a 6-3, 6-4 defeat.

No. 1 Stanford opened its first Pac-10 road trip by edging No. 22 Arizona State 4-3 on Friday afternoon in Tempe, Ariz.

Despite losing the doubles point, the Cardinal (6-1) stormed back to win four singles matches in its first road match of the year.

Arizona State took a 1-0 advantage on the strength of a sweep in doubles. The Sun Devils won close matches at the Nos. 2 and 3 positions while capturing a decisive 8-1 win at No. 1.

But the Cardinal turned things around with strong singles play. Theresa Logar dispatched of No. 100 Sabrina Cappanolo 6-4, 6-4 at the No. 1 spot, highlighting four singles wins.

The Cardinal looked sharp in singles and doubles even with a shuffled lineup. With Celia Durkin unavailable due to illness, Lejla Hodzic paired up with Jessica Nguyen at No. 2 doubles while Megan Doheny played in just her third career dual match at No. 6 singles.

The result turned out to be the same: a convincing Cardinal victory in the postseason. Stanford extended its NCAA winning streak to 19 matches.
