Credentials

All requests for working press, photo and broadcast credentials for Stanford's home games should be made in writing on company letterhead to Brian Risso, Director of Athletic Communications, via e-mail (brisso@stanford.edu), fax (650-725-2957) or phone (650-723-4418) at least 48 hours prior to the event. All credentials will be left at the media will call window at the northwest entrance of Maples Pavilion. Only media who cover Stanford on a regular basis will be considered for season credentials. Single-game credentials will be issued on a priority basis to daily newspapers, originating radio and television stations, national weekly or monthly publications, electronic media outlets and local and regional television crews.

Photo Credentials/Regulations

Photo credentials will be issued to photographers on assignment from accredited newsgathering organizations. Freelance photographers not on assignment will not be considered for photo credentials. All requests must be made at least 24 hours prior to each game. Photographers are not allowed in front or behind team benches and must shoot from the baseline. Flash photography is not permitted.

Media Seating Area

Media seating is assigned in the upper press area, located on the second level of the east side of Maples Pavilion. The upper press area is equipped with phone lines and wireless Internet access. A user name and password will be provided to credentialed members of the media on game day.

Online Credentialing Policy

Credentials for online media services will only be issued to those outlets that are a part of national newsgathering organizations, reach a broad audience, produce original content and employ full-time journalists. Any exceptions must be approved by the Stanford Athletics Communications Office.

Parking

Limited parking space is available in the lot adjacent to Maples Pavilion or Parking Structure 7, located under the Knight Management Center across the street. The Maples Pavilion Lot and a portion of Parking Structure 7 will be restricted to Stanford Basketball parking passes only. Additional parking is available at the Varsity Lot adjacent to Sunken Diamond. A limited number of parking passes are available for members of the media, and outlets covering Stanford Athletics will have first priority. University parking permits are not required on weekends or after 4 p.m. on weekdays. Please plan on arriving early to secure a parking spot.

Postgame Interviews

Approximately 10 minutes after each home game, head coach Johnny Dawkins and requested players will be available for a press conference in the media workroom, which is on the floor level at the south end of Maples Pavilion. There will also be an opportunity for one-on-one interviews if requested. Postgame interview requests for visiting head coach and/or players should be coordinated through the school's media relations department.

Scouts

According to Pac-12 regulations, NBA scouts must purchase tickets for Stanford men's basketball games. Please contact the Stanford Athletics Ticket Office at (650) 723-1021 to purchase tickets.

Weekly Press Conferences

Head coach Johnny Dawkins will hold a weekly press conference in the media workroom at Maples Pavilion beginning in January. Please contact Director of Athletic Communications Brian Risso to confirm dates and times. Select players will also be available at the press conference. Scott Reiss Radio Play-by-Play

Scott Reiss enters his first season as the team's play-by-play announcer.

Reiss, who is also Stanford's play-by-play voice for football broadcasts, has served the last five years as anchor/reporter at Comcast SportsNet Bay Area, hosting San Francisco Giants, Oakland A's and San Jose Sharks pregame and postgame shows while also covering Stanford sports on a regular basis and handling play-by-play duties for Pac-12 and West Coast Conference games. Reiss has also hosted sports talk radio at 95.7 FM "The Game," including "Bay Area Gameday," a weekly college football and

basketball show.

Reiss' experience nationally includes an eight-year stint with ESPN, where he anchored several shows including SportsCenter, College Football Live and College Gamenight and handled play-by-play for ESPN Radio college football and ESPN-TV college basketball. He also hosted College Gameday on ESPN Radio.

A 1993 graduate of Stanford, Reiss was the play-by-play broadcaster for Cardinal football, men's basketball and baseball games on KZSU 90.1 FM from 1992-94.



John Platz Radio Color Analyst

John Platz, a reserve guard on the Stanford men's basketball team from 1982-84, begins his 25th season as a member of the broadcast team, having served as both play-by-voice (3 seasons) and color analyst (21 seasons) on Cardinal basketball broadcasts dating back to 1989.

Platz also serves as the sideline reporter for football radio broadcasts, and has hosted the "Inside Stanford Sports with Johnny Dawkins" in-season coach's radio show.

Platz was the radio play-by-play voice of the NCAA champion Stanford baseball team during the 1988 and 1989 seasons, and has also served as a fill-in Stanford football play-by-play announcer at various times since 1993. A native of San Marino, Calif., Platz is the only announcer to have broadcast a Stanford game at each of the men's basketball NCAA Final Four, baseball's College World Series and a BCS football bowl game.

Platz has also written feature stories chronicling memorable moments in Stanford sports history for the department's official athletics website, www.gostanford.com. His late grandfather was a member of the 1920 U.S. Olympic track team which competed in Antwerp, Belgium.

A 1984 Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Stanford with a degree in economics, Platz earned J.D. (law) and M.B.A. degrees at Stanford in 1989. In addition to his duties on Stanford's radio teams, he is currently Senior Counsel at Cisco Systems.
