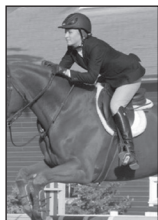
SHIRLEY SCHOOF CLUB SPORTS ATHLETE OF THE YEAR AWARD

ARTHUR F. DAUER MEMORIAL SPORTS PERFORMANCE AWARD

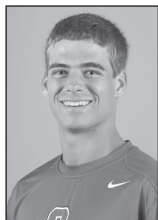

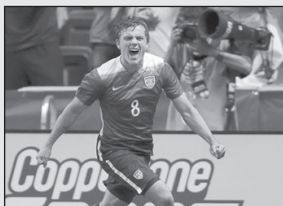


SIMONE MANUEL SWIMMING AND DIVING – UNDECLARED

The Forman-Watkins Scholarship

After winning the 50-yard freestyle in a school-record time of 21.31 for her first national title, Manuel recorded the sport's fastest 100-yard split of 45.45 in the final leg of Stanford's record-setting 400-yard medley relay. Manuel entered the water more than two seconds after Virginia's Ellen Thomas, but caught up to win by .01 while also holding off California's Missy Franklin. Stanford's relay squad clocked in at 3:26.41, an NCAA and American record.

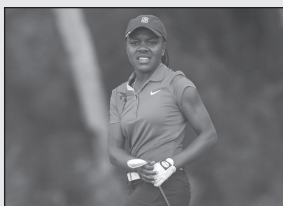
Jordan Morris, soccer: Earning his third cap in his fourth call-up, Morris started and scored a goal for the U.S. Men's National Team during its 2-0 win over Mexico in San Antonio. Morris made history in the 49th minute when he corralled a loose ball in the top of the penalty area, broke through and beat Mexico goalkeeper Cirilo Saucedo from 10 yards out. The first collegian to start for the U.S. in over two decades, Morris is the sixth USMNT player to score his first career goal against Mexico, joining Josh Wolff, Jimmy Conrad, Jozy Altidore, Michael Orozco and Landon Donovan.



Kiley Neushul, water polo: Kiley Neushul converted a penalty shot for the game-winner with 11 seconds remaining as Stanford captured its fourth NCAA title in five years and fifth in school history with a 7-6 win over UCLA. After the Bruins were unable to retain possession on a loose ball and subsequently whistled for an illegal timeout, the Cardinal was awarded a five-meter penalty. Neushul, who scored five goals, calmly put away a skip shot to the keeper's left and secured Stanford's 106th NCAA crown while extending the nation's best streak of years with at least one NCAA championship to 39, dating back to 1976-77.



David Nolan, swimming and diving: Nolan broke his own American record in the 200-yard individual medley during the opening day of NCAA Championships, finishing 1:39.38 (21.67, 24.32, 29.21, 24.18) to become the first swimmer ever to post a sub-1:40 time in the event. Nolan smashed his own NCAA and American record of 1:40.07 established at the Pac-12 Championships earlier that month. He also claimed the U.S. Open, NCAA Championships and school records with the performance and registered Stanford's 114th individual NCAA title in program history and NCAA-best 11th in the event.



Mariah Stackhouse, golf: Stackhouse converted a two-putt par on the 19th hole, lifting Stanford to its first-ever NCAA title with a 3-2 victory over Baylor. Stackhouse birdied the last two holes of regulation to force sudden death after the teams split the first four matches. Down two in match play with the other four matches decided, Stackhouse birdied the 17th and 18th holes to send the match to a 19th hole, which was played on the par-4 10th. Stackhouse found the back of the green on her second shot, before leaving her putt within a foot, besting Hayley Davis for the title.

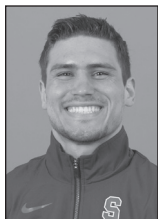

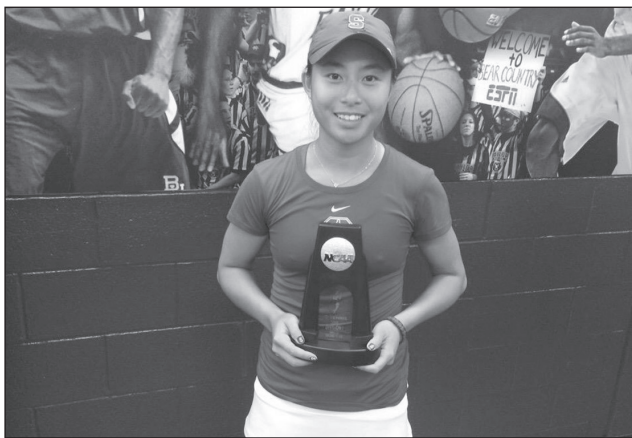

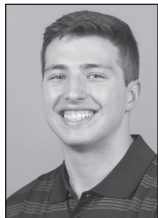

To do so, the athletic board supports and nourishes athletic, physical education, and recreation programs at the university and works to ensure that all such programs operate under the highest standards of ethical conduct, sportsmanship, and integrity.

The Stanford Athletic Board was established in 1964 by the Stanford University Board of Trustees.

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
