THE FARM FIVE

NONCONFERENCE FINALE

Stanford closes out both the calendar year and nonconference play on Sunday evening with a 6 p.m. PT game against Carroll College at Maples Pavilion. The game is the fifth in a season-long seven-game home-stand for the Cardinal. Sunday's contest will air live on Pac-12 Networks, with JB Long and Steve Lavin on the call courtside. Stanford alums John Platz and Scott Reiss will have the call on KNBR 1050 AM.

BALANCED SCORING ATTACK

Stanford's balanced scoring attack includes four guys averaging more than 12 ppg. The Cardinal is one of just two teams in the Pac-12 (UCLA is the other) to have four guys average at least 12.8 ppg. Rosco Allen (13.8 ppg) ranks 17th in the Pac-12 in scoring, while Dorian Pickens (13.0 ppg) ranks 25th, and Marcus Allen (12.8 ppg) and Reid Travis (12.8 ppg) are tied for 27th.

HOME SWEET HOME

Stanford has won five of its first seven home games of the 2015-16 season and has won eight of its last 10 at home overall. The Cardinal owns a 97-32 record at Maples Pavilion under head coach Johnny Dawkins. Stanford has won at least 10 home games for 22 straight seasons dating back to 1992-93.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

Stanford's first 10 opponents have totaled 70 victories already this season through Dec. 23. The four teams - SMU, Villanova, Saint Mary's and Texas - the Cardinal has suffered setbacks to this season own a combined record of 38-6 this season through Dec. 23.

FROM DOWNTOWN

Stanford ranks fifth in the Pac-12 with a .365 three-point field goal percentage. The duo of Rosco Allen and Dorian Pickens has combined to shoot 40-of-99 (.404) this season. Allen leads the Cardinal with 21 three-pointers, while Pickens has 19. Pickens registered a career-high six three-pointers (6-of-7) in Stanford's game against Texas.

SOPHOMORE IMPACT

Stanford's sophomore class has played a major role in the Cardinal's success this season. Despite playing without injured point guard Robert Cartwright, the unit that includes Reid Travis (12.8 ppg), Michael Humphrey (9.8 ppg) and Dorian Pickens (13.0 ppg) has accounted for 46.0 percent of Stanford's points this season. Starting forwards Travis (7.1 rpg) and Humphrey (6.7 rpg) have accounted for 33.8 percent of the Cardinal's rebounds this season. Travis has missed the last two games and is out indefinitely with a leg injury.

ROSCO ALLEN FROM DEEP

Rosco Allen is averaging 13.8 ppg this season. Nearly half of his field goals (21-of-43) have come from three-point range. The senior ranks ninth in the Pac-12, shooting 42.9 percent (21-of-49) from beyond the arc. He has recorded multiple three-pointers in seven of Stanford's 10 games with at least three in a contest five times. He has totaled 13 three-pointers in his last five games.

PRODUCING IN INCREASED ROLES

With the graduation of starters Chasson Randle, Anthony Brown and Stefan Nastic following last season, several members of the Cardinal have stepped in to increased roles this year. The Cardinal's current lineup of Rosco Allen, Marcus Allen, Michael Humphrey, Dorian Pickens and Christian Sanders combined to average 23.7 points in 91.4 (18.3 per player) minutes per game last season. That same group is averaging a combined 55.6 points in 142.7 (28.5 per player) minutes this year.

STRONG START FOR MARCUS ALLEN

Junior Marcus Allen scored 18 points in 24 minutes in his season debut against SMU after missing the first two games with a foot injury. Allen was inserted into the starting lineup the next game against Saint Mary's, where he finished with 14 points in 28 minutes. The shooting guard has scored in double figures in six of the eight games he has played in this season. He ranks third on the Cardinal in scoring, averaging 12.8 ppg.

HUMPHREY FILLING UP THE BOX SCORE

Sophomore Michael Humphrey is averaging 9.8 points, 6.7 rebounds and 2.1 blocks per game this season. He ranks sixth in the Pac-12 in blocks per game. Humphrey has started eight of Stanford's 10 games, including each of the last six contests. The forward, who posted a career-high 21 points against Sacramento State last time out, has two double-doubles with 13 points and 11 rebounds against Green Bay and 13 points and 12 rebounds vs. Charleston Southern. He has four career double-doubles in 40 career games.

PICKENS PROVIDES SCORING PUNCH

Sophomore Dorian Pickens is second on the team in scoring, averaging 13.0 ppg. He also ranks second in three-pointers with 19. Pickens has registered 12, three-pointers and totaled 60 points in his last three games, also scoring 20 against Sacramento State and 16 against DePaul. He connected on a career-high six three-pointers on 6-of-7 shooting en route to a career-best 24 points against Texas. The sophomore posted his first career double-double, with 11 points and a career-best 10 rebounds against No. 8 Villanova. After averaging 2.1 points in 9.8 minutes last season, he ranks second on the team in scoring this season with 13.0 points in 28.2 minutes.

BROOKLYN COMEBACK

Stanford erased a 17-point deficit (48-65) with 6:11 to play, scoring 21 of the game's final 22 points to earn a 69-66 come-from-behind victory over Arkansas in the NIT Season Tip-Off Nov. 27 at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn. Senior Rosco Allen scored eight of his career-high 25 points in the final 4:27 of the game.

TRAVIS A FORCE IN THE PAINT

Sophomore Reid Travis leads the team in rebounds (7.1 rpg) and ranks fourth in points (12.8 ppg). His team-leading 55.7 field goal percentage ranks 12th in the conference. He scored a career-best 18 points at Saint Mary's and collected a season-high 12 rebounds against Villanova. Travis is out indefinitely with a stress reaction in his left leg.

SANDERS, THE FLOOR GENERAL

After totaling 81 points in 61 games over his first three seasons at Stanford, senior point guard Christian Sanders has combined to record 62 points in 10 contests this year. He scored a career-high 23 points in a career-long 31 minutes in the season-opening win over Green Bay. The senior is also averaging 3.1 assists per game with a career-best eight in the win over Charleston Southern on Nov. 15.

QUARTERBACKS TURNED POST PLAYERS

Sophomore forwards Reid Travis and Michael Humphrey were each the quarterback of their high school football team. Travis was the signal caller for three years at DeLaSalle HS in Minnesota, before deciding to focus on basketball his senior year. Humphrey was the starting quarterback at Sunnyslope HS in Phoenix.

FRESHMEN MAKING IMMEDIATE CONTRIBUTIONS

The Cardinal's three-member freshman class of Josh Sharma, Marcus Sheffield and Cameron Walker have each seen action this season. Sheffield is the lone newcomer to see time in all 10 contests, earning the start in the season opener against Green Bay. Walker, who missed the first four games of the year with a calf injury, has totaled 54 minutes in six games. Sharma has registered eight blocks in 48 minutes over eight games.

CONTROLLING THE GLASS

Stanford's 55 rebounds against Villanova in the NIT Season Tip-Off on Nov. 26 were the most by the Cardinal in the Johnny Dawkins era. Dawkins, in his eighth season as head coach of the Cardinal, has seen Stanford record 50 or more rebounds in a game six times.

CARTWRIGHT SIDELINED FOR SEASON

Sophomore guard Robert Cartwright sustained a compound fracture in his right arm and will miss the 2015-16 season. The injury occurred during Stanford's team practice at Maples Pavilion on Nov. 2. Cartwright underwent successful surgery and will begin his rehabilitation period in the coming weeks. Cartwright played in all but one game, earning one start, as a freshman during Stanford's 2015 Postseason NIT Championship run. The point guard averaged 1.9 points in 11.1 minutes per game. He shot 33.3 percent from three-point range.

STANFORD TO PLAY IN SHANGHAI IN 2016

Stanford will open the 2016-17 season against Harvard in the 2016 Pac-12 China game, scheduled to be played in Shanghai on Nov. 12, 2016, Pac-12 Commissioner Larry Scott announced on Nov. 13. The game, which will be televised live back in the United States on Nov. 11, will tip off the 2016-17 men's basketball season.

The 2016 Pac-12 China Game will be presented by Alibaba Group with Federation of University Sports of China (FUSC), which operates under China's Ministry of Education, serving as the co-host for the game.

Specific venue and U.S. and China broadcast information for the 2016 Pac-12 China Game will be finalized at a later date. The game is the latest event of Pac-12 Global, an unprecedented effort to promote goodwill for the Conference and its member institutions through sport, and to provide student-athletes with a transformative cultural exchange experience.

CARDINAL IN THE NBA

Five former Stanford standouts – Brook Lopez (Brooklyn Nets), Robin Lopez (New York Knicks), Dwight Powell (Dallas Mavericks), Josh Huestis (Oklahoma City Thunder) and Anthony Brown (Los Angeles Lakers) – opened the 2015-16 season on NBA rosters. Powell, Huestis and Brown all played under head coach Johnny Dawkins. Brook Lopez leads the Nets in scoring (20.2 ppg) and ranks second on Brooklyn's roster in rebounds (8.0 rpg). Dwight Powell, in his second year in the NBA, is averaging 9.0 ppg and 6.5 rpg for the Dallas Mavericks.

TOUR OF ITALY

Stanford enjoyed a 17-day tour of Italy from Aug. 19-Sept. 4, playing six exhibition games against some of the country's top professional teams. The program also had an opportunity to explore the country, visiting Rome, Florence, Venice, Bologna, Como and Pesaro during its exhibition tour.

TRI-CAPTAINS

Senior Rosco Allen, junior Marcus Allen and sophomore Reid Travis were voted captains for the 2015-16 season. Combined, the trio has played in 180 career games. All three averaged more than 20 minutes per game last season for the Cardinal.

PRESEASON RECOGNITION

Sports Illustrated projected sophomore Reid Travis as one of the nation's breakout scorers, while junior Marcus Allen was recognized as one of the nation's projected under the radar breakout players by CBS Sports College Basketball Insider Jon Rothstein.

STANBACK JOINS CARDINAL

Trevor Stanback, regarded as one of the highest-rated prospects on the West Coast, has signed a National Letter of Intent with Stanford on Nov. 12. Stanback, a 6-10, 220-pound power forward from Maranatha High School in Pasadena, Calif., is a consensus four-star prospect by the major recruiting services.

He ranks as the 13th-best power forward in the nation by Scout.com and 68th-best prospect overall. A member of the Rivals100 for the Class of 2016, the group ranks him as the 88th-best prospect nationally. Scout.com ranks the power forward as the third-best prospect in the state of California, while ESPN's recruiting service has him as the ninth-best prospect in the Golden State. He is rated the 18th-best power forward in the nation by 247Sports.

Johnny Dawkins' contributions since arriving on The Farm have come in the form of both team and individual success, most notably guiding the Cardinal to the 2014 NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 and the 2012 Postseason NIT championship.

Meanwhile, Dawkins has also been responsible for overseeing the development of Landry Fields, Josh Huestis and Dwight Powell, all of whom parlayed outstanding senior seasons into NBA Draft selections. Huestis (first round) and Powell (second round) were taken in the first round of the 2014 NBA Draft while Fields (second round) was chosen in 2010.

Dawkins has also made significant strides off the court, with the 2014 recruiting class representing the latest top-20 crop of freshmen to arrive on The Farm. Even more impressively, that same young talent is being developed quickly. In 2012, Chasson Randle became the fourth player to earn All-Freshman Team status among conference players during Dawkins' tenure following a six-year period in which only two Cardinal rookies were honored.

A very high standard in the classroom has also been established during Dawkins' tenure. In 2013-14, Stanford totaled the most Pac-12 All-Academic selections (6) of any conference school for the fifth consecutive season while Powell and Randle were tabbed back-to-back Pac-12 Scholar-Athletes of the Year.

The 2013-14 campaign was especially memorable, as Stanford (23-13, 10-8 Pac-12) advanced to the Sweet 16 for only the fifth time in school history after upsets of No. 7 seed New Mexico and No. 2 seed Kansas. Despite losing two starters and two key reserves to season-ending injuries, the Cardinal finished tied for third in the highly-competitive Pac-12.

Stanford finished 19-15 overall two seasons ago, advancing to the NIT second round. The Cardinal finished 9-9 in the Pac-12, swept the season series against California for the first time since 2008 and notched a 76-52 home upset of No. 10/12 Oregon.

Stanford produced a 26-11 record in 2011-12 en route to capturing the Postseason NIT title, the third championship in school history. The Cardinal chalked up its best win total since a 28-8 campaign in 2007-08. Stanford was the Pac-12's winningest program and tallied a league-best four top-50 RPI victories.

The Cardinal concluded the 2010-11 season at 15-16, fielding a team without a senior for the first time in school history. Stanford finished 14-18 during the 2009-10 campaign, Dawkins' second year at the helm.

In 2008-09, Dawkins directed Stanford to a 20-14 record and reached the CBI semifinals. In addition to surpassing Robert Burnett as the winningest first-year head coach in school history, Dawkins ranked third in victories among 21 first-year head coaches in Division I with no prior college head coaching experience.

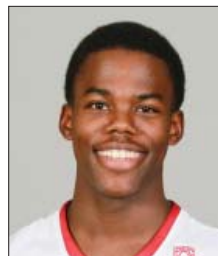
