Off to its best start since 2012, Stanford continues its season-opening barrage of eight games in nine days with a trip to Texas to take on the Longhorns. The four-game set begins Thursday and each game can be seen on the Longhorn Network or heard on KZSU radio.

SERIES HISTORY

All-time vs. Texas

- **Overall (first meeting in 1981): 34-31-1 (.523) | Streak: Texas, 2**
- **Last Series: W, 5-4; W, 5-3; L, 3-1; L, 12-4 at Sunken Diamond (March 5-8, 2015)**
 - Stanford dropped two of three in their last visit to Austin in 2014.
 - The season prior, Fullerton ended Stanford's season in the Fullerton Regional, 6-5.
 - These two teams are 6-6 all-time against each other in the NCAA Tournament with the last such meeting coming in 2006—Stanford won the Austin Regional which included a 12-8 win over Texas.

COACHING MATCHUP

- Texas head coach Augie Garrido is college baseball's all-time wins leader with 1,952 career victories.
- Stanford's Mark Marquess is third among active coaches and fourth all-time with 1,557 career wins.
- In Garrido's tenure at Texas, Marquess holds a slight head-to-head advantage, 31-28-1.
- Garrido has won five national championships to Marquess' two (1987-88).

LAST WEEKEND

Stanford played four games in three days due to an Opening Day rain out. The Cardinal swept a doubleheader on Saturday. Tristan Beck became just the third Cardinal freshman to start on Opening Day since 1988, joining Mike Mussina and teammate Cal Quantrill. In 6.1 innings, he gave up just two hits, struck out a pair and walked just one. Mikey Diekroeger hit a solo shot in the fourth and Stanford took the first game, 2-0.

Chris Castellanos held the Titans to one run over six innings in the nightcap. Jonny Locher scored on Jack Klein's RBI groundout in the second and Diekroeger registered his second GW RBI of the day with a two-out single in fifth. Colton Hock retired all nine batters he faced for a 2-1 win.

Cal State Fullerton scored three runs on five straight hits in the second inning and held off a Stanford rally—which included a three-run sixth—to top Stanford, 4-3 in the series finale on Sunday.

Stanford rebounded on Monday when Tommy Edman tied a career high with three hits and was knocked home all three times by Quinn Brodey. Brett Hanewich pitched 7.0 innings and allowed an unearned run en route to a 5-2 win at UC Davis.

UP NEXT

- Stanford returns home for all but two mid-week games between March 1-April 5.
- The Cardinal hosts St. Mary's on Tuesday before a three-game set with 2015 national runner-up Vanderbilt at Sunken Diamond, March 4-6.
- Stanford's next overnight trip will be in 38 days—at UCLA, April 7-9.

CARDINAL NOTES

Stanford Start ✓

- Stanford won its season-opening series for the first time since a three-game home sweep of Vanderbilt in 2012.
- At 3-1, this is the best start for the program since winning the first eight games of 2012.

Stanford Starters 🌲 ✓

- In the team's three wins this season, the Cardinal starters have each gone at least six innings and allowed one run or fewer.
- In those three wins, the starters gave up just one earned run in 19.1 innings (0.47 ERA), surrendered just 10 hits, walked one and struck out eight.
- Starters were credited with each of the three wins due to a strong bullpen which has allowed just one run in 11.2 innings (0.77 ERA) this season and struck out 13 compared to just three walks.
- As a staff, Stanford went 25.1 innings without a walk until two in the eighth on Monday.

Pac-12 Pitcher of the Week 🔥

- Tristan Beck earned the conference honor on Tuesday—the first Stanford hurler to win the award since 2013 MLB first overall pick, Mark Appel, did so in May of 2013.
- Beck became the second Stanford freshman to start Opening Day since Mike Mussina in 1988 (teammate Cal Quantrill was the other in 2014).

Early Impact 🌟

- Several freshmen are off to a hot start, including Nico Hoerner, who has started all four games and collected two hits in his collegiate debut.
- Kris Bubic induced three easy ground balls for a 1-2-3 inning and picked up a save in his collegiate debut at UC Davis on Monday.

Klein Field at Sunken Diamond Enhancements 🆕 🌐

- Long regarded as one of the most beautiful college baseball facilities in the country, Klein Field at Sunken Diamond underwent several renovations this offseason.
- Upgraded playing surface—completely replaced, laser-graded flat, features Bermuda grass and top-grade Pennsylvania clay in addition to new irrigation system.
- A modernized and expanded clubhouse now includes a players lounge, dedicated athletic training space and coaches locker room.
- Other developments included the modification and expansion of the ticket office, concession stands and restrooms.

They're Here! 🧐

- Head Coach Mark Marquess added 11 freshmen in his latest recruiting class.
- Three pitchers (one lefty), four infielders, three outfielders and a catcher. Six are from the homestate of California, three from Georgia and one apiece from Colorado and Nevada.

They're Back! 🙌

- Nearly 80 percent of Stanford's starting lineup and rotation return from a year ago.
- More than 80 percent of the Cardinal's at-bats, runs, hits and RBI from 2015 are back on the roster.
- Cal Quantrill and John Hochstatter are both set to return for the 2016 season after both missed the majority of the 2015 campaign due to injury. Each pitcher underwent Tommy John surgery last year.
- Despite short seasons from Quantrill and Hochstatter, the Cardinal will have more than 70 percent of its wins, strikeouts and innings back.

CARDINAL NOTES

Preseason All-America

- Juniors Cal Quantrill and Tommy Edman each earned preseason All-America accolades.
- Quantrill was name third team Louisville Slugger Preseason All-America accolades from Collegiate Baseball News, and third team preseason All-America accolades from Baseball America.
- Quantrill was a Louisville Slugger and Perfect Game Freshman All-American before his sophomore season was cut short due to injury. Prior to the injury, the Port Hope, Ontario, native was 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA last season. As a freshman, Quantrill was 7-5 with a 2.68 ERA in 17 starts, which included two complete games and 98 strikeouts in 110.2 innings. He earned All-Pac-12 honors and was named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year.
- A math and computational science major, Edman was the only Cardinal to start every game last season and finished with a team-high 29 RBI, 13 doubles, 22 multi-hit games, and was third on the team with a .296 average.

Watch List

- Junior Cal Quantrill was also named to the Golden Spikes Award preseason watch list.
- One of 50 players named to the award given annually to the nation's top amateur player.
- One of 4 players to be on that list for the second straight year.

2016 Schedule

- Only USC and Arizona State will have more televised games on the conference network (19) than the Cardinal this year.

Preseason Prognostications

- Pac-12 coaches picked Stanford baseball to finish seventh in the conference in 2016.
- Oregon State was selected as the favorite. The Beavers earned 98 points and eight first-place votes, while Stanford garnered 49 points.
