### H.R. 1 Status Update

Title IV of the "Implementing Recommendations of the 9/11 Commission Act of 2007" directs the Administrator of FEMA to:

- 1. (NLT 02 AUG 08) Develop standards for credentialing and typing Federal Emergency Response Officials (FERO)
  - a. Status: 10 June 08 FEMA defined the FERO standard in a policy letter to OMB (ahead of schedule)
  - b. GSA posted FERO standard on website <a href="www.idmanagement.gov">www.idmanagement.gov</a>
- (NLT 02 FEB 09) Establish a Federal Preparedness database system for real-time accountability and awareness
  - **a. Status:** DoD already has a 90K-seat pilot repository for DoD FEROs within the National Capital Region (NCR) and FEMA will stand-up a 100K-seat repository for non-DoD FEROs within the NCR by 20 Oct 08 (ahead of schedule)
  - b. FERO repository will be ready for agency population/management and will leverage HSPD 12 / FIPS 201 credentials and technology for real-time accountability and awareness
  - c. FEMA will provide agencies with manpower support to capture FERO attributes and provide sustainment capability for continued enrollments/revocations

### 6 Steps for FERO Registration

- 1. Self pre-enrollment of applicable FERO designations (www.ferosnapshot.com)
- 2. Identify all source authority Attribute Administrators with each agency
- 3. Agency-designated Attribute Administrators to confirm pre-enrolled FEROs
- 4. FERO Registrar enrollment of agency-confirmed FEROs
- 5. Agency integration of the web-secure software for repository population
- 6. Agency FERO Registrar training for sustainment / revocation
