## **EXTENSION CORDS**

- 1. Temporary wiring for electrical power and lighting installations is allowed for a period not to exceed 90 days for holiday decorative lighting, carnivals and similar purposes and for experimental or developmental work.
- 2 Electrical wiring, devices, appliance and other equipment which are modified or damaged and constitute an electrical shock or fire hazard shall not be used.
- 3. Extension cords shall not be used as a substitute for permanent wiring
- 4. Extension cords shall only be used with portable appliances while such appliances are in immediate use.
- 5. Extension cords shall be plugged directly into an approved receptacle or power tap.
- 6 Power tap shall be connected to a permanently installed receptacle.
- 7. The ampacity of the extension cords shall not be less than the rated capacity of the portable appliance supplied by the cord.
- 8. The extension cords shall be maintained in good condition without splices, deteriorations or damage.
- 9. Extension cords shall be grounded when serving grounded portable appliances.
- 10. Extension cords shall NOT be:
  - affixed to structures:
  - extended through walls, ceilings, or floors;
  - under doors or floor coverings; or
  - subjected to environmental or physical damage.
