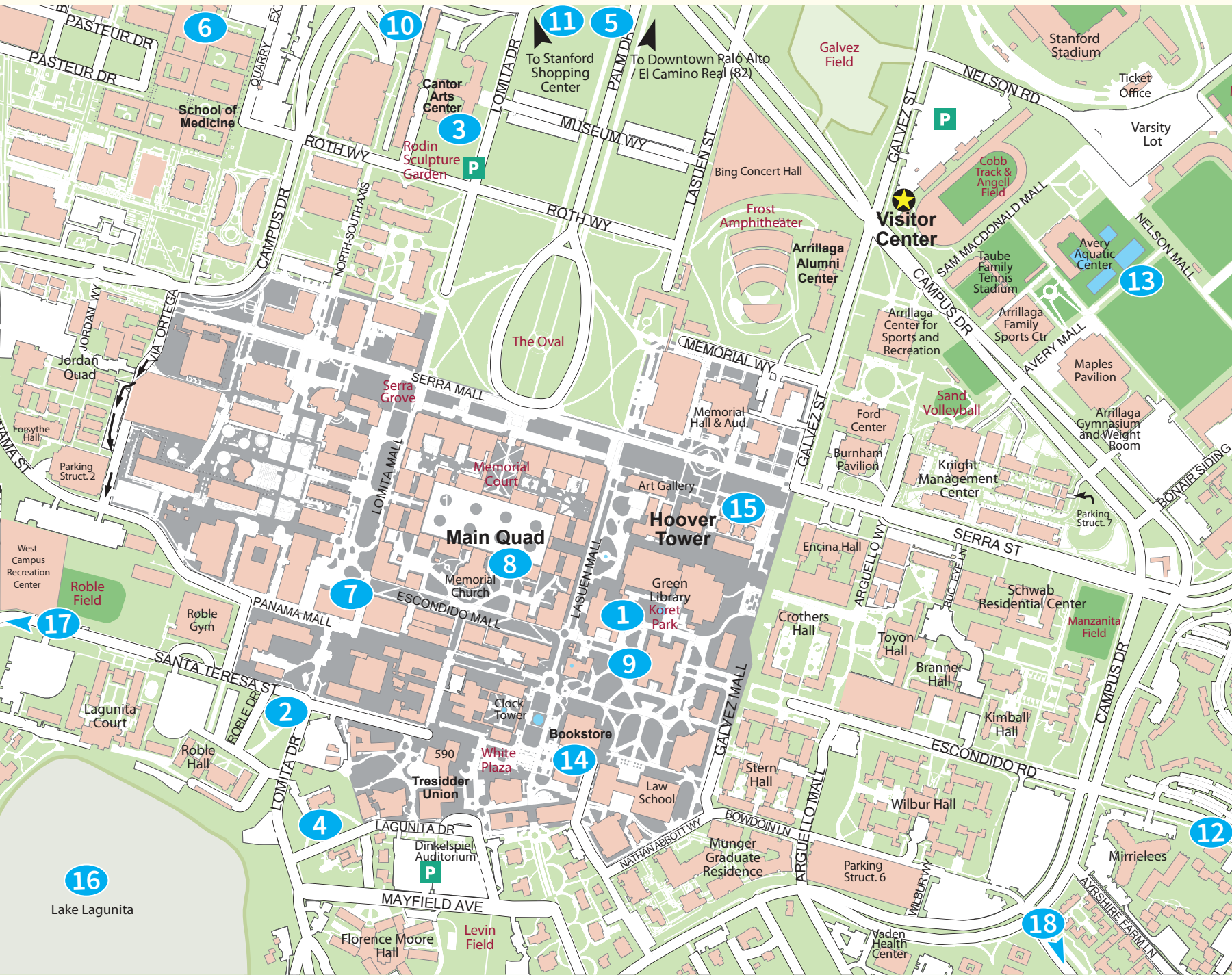

1 Green Library fountain

One of the most popular structures on campus, this fountain is known for being loud, visually interesting and for having a strong waterfall spray.

2 Papua New Guinea sculpture garden

This garden contains 40 wood and stone carvings of people, animals, and magical beings that illustrate the creation stories and cultural traditions of Papua New Guinea.

3 Cantor Art Museum

This museum presents one of the largest collections of works, outside Paris, of Auguste Rodin, including 20 major works in the Rodin Sculpture Garden.

4 Kingscote Garden koi ponds

Hidden between Tresidder Union and Lomita Drive are the quiet and serene Kingscote Gardens, home to an intimate garden with two koi ponds.

5 Arizona cactus garden

This botanical garden, specializing in cactus and succulents, is located on the south side of the Mausoleum off of Quarry Road between Campus Drive and Arboretum Road.

6 LPCH model railroad

A large model railroad set (with sound effects) is housed in the lobby of the Lucile Packard Children's Hospital.

7 Branner Geology Library mineral display

The second floor of the Branner Library is home to a small, permanent mineral exhibit.

8 Memorial Church

Inspired by churches in the region of Venice, this church features stained glass windows, extensive mosaics and four pipe organs.

9 Clock Tower

This mechanical clock chimes the hours. The clock's mechanisms are viewable from the outside.

10 Stone River

This 320-foot wall-like serpentine sculpture made of sandstone, set in about three acres of land, is one of the largest works of outdoor art at Stanford.

11 Mausoleum

Located in the Stanford University Arboretum, the Mausoleum has Egyptian-style male sphinxes in the front and Greek-style female sphinxes in the back.

12 Stanford Campus Recreation Assoc.

This swim and tennis club is for Stanford faculty, senior staff and their families. Membership is required.

13 Avery Aquatic Center

This aquatic center designates an area of the pool for family swimming. Family Swim hours are posted on the website.

14 Stanford Bookstore fountain

The most common fountain for "fountain hopping" is The Claw.

15 Hoover Tower

The 285-foot tower is a community landmark. Step off the elevator on the fourteenth floor to view local sights from the observation platform. At the top of the tower, you can see a carillon of 48 bells.

16 Lake Lagunita

Lake Lagunita is seasonal, drying up in summer when the inflow from San Francisquito Creek is blocked. Wildlife can often be seen while walking the 0.9-mile perimeter trail.

17 Red Barn

The Victorian Red Barn has 67 stalls and offers picnic areas.

18 Stanford Dish

The area around the Dish offers a popular 3.5-mile recreational trail known for its daunting hills and spectacular views.
