Program Requirements

Your group has two options to qualify for a dumpster. If you received a dumpster in the past 12 months, you must complete the other option to qualify for a dumpster this year.

Option 1

Within the last 12 months, your group must have attended two of the following events:

- National Night Out (annual event in August)
- Citywide Exercise (annual event, 5 attendees signed in)
- "Five Critical Steps" Presentation scheduled through Berkeley Fire Department
- Public Health Presentation
- Neighborhood Watch Meeting scheduled through Police Community Services Bureau

Option 2

Within the last 12 months, five (5) members of your group must have completed one of the following:

- Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Academy
- Single-session CERT training (Like Fire Safety)

Program Overview

Is your community working to increase public safety and preparedness for disaster? If your neighborhood meets the dumpster requirements, you are eligible for a FREE 16-cubic-yard dumpster for a weekend.

To apply to receive a dumpster:

- 1. Meet the Dumpster Program requirements (described at left)
- 2. Complete the dumpster application found at:

Dumpster Rules

- All dumpsters are delivered on Fridays between 7 am and 2 pm, and picked up on Mondays between 7 am and 2 pm.
- No dumpster deliveries on holiday weekends.
- Group receiving dumpster must block off dumpster delivery location using signs provided by the City's Permit Service Center. Space must be at least two cars long.
- The representative of the neighborhood reserving the dumpster is responsible for the management of the dumpster.

Items NOT allowed in the dumpster:

- No hazardous materials
- No flammables (i.e. spray paint cans)
- No paint, chemicals, or solvents
- No motor oil
- No batteries
- No refrigerators
- No TV sets
- No rocks, dirt, or concrete
- Nothing with Freon
- No medications or drugs
- No plant debris or pesticides
- No overflowing or spillage
