

-- This is Commissioner Roberts's last Commission meeting; he will attend the next Probation & Parole Questioning Subcommittee meeting and resign effective Aug. 15.

- -- Currently 162 sworn officers. Swore in a lateral yesterday. Class of 3 starting academy Monday. Conducting background on 4 laterals. 7 more laterals interviewed today.
- -- Coffee With A Cop held last Sat. at Nabolom. Next one Aug. 28 at 2131 Durant, 10 a.m. 12 p.m.; all are invited.
- -- Council approved receipt of two grants. 1) State Office of Traffic Safety to support enhanced traffic enforcement; and 2) State Dept. of Alcohol & Beverage Control. Have gotten ABC grant 10 out of the past 11 12 years, thanks to Ofc. Rego's efforts. Boosts resources for enforcement of alcohol laws.

-- Over the weekend, a series of 3 sex grab cases. Ofcs. Martinez & Nabozny spotted person matching suspect description and detained; eventually arrested for all 3. In another case, a woman was dragged to secluded location and sexually assaulted. Officer spotted suspect and detained him; now in custody.

Dear PRC Commissioners,

As you know, the usage policy for Berkeley's automated license plate readers (#1302) was referred to your Lexipol subcommittee, which meant to discuss it on the 7th of August. I attended that meeting and unfortunately, I need to raise some concerns on two fronts prior to your consideration of the proposed use policy in September.

I would like to start by encouraging you to watch the Council discussion regarding the acquisition of this equipment on July 11, 2017. To make if (relatively) easy, I have pulled the 40 minute discussion out of the 5.5 hour meeting video and it is available <u>here</u>.

All is included but the public comment, which was 8 speakers, all opposed.

If you are unable to watch the 40 minute video, I have provided a list of quotes from the video that provide some insight into the Council's intentions and expectations for the use of this equipment at the time of acquisition.

It is crystal clear that the intention and discussion was that the use of the equipment was for parking enforcement. Mayor Arreguin stated that the grant funds used to purchase the readers were restricted for parking enforcement and support of the Go-Berkeley program. Councilmember Hahn stated that the administrative use policy

#1-2016, wich has largely been imported into 1302, was leaky and full of holes that needed to be plugged. Mayor Arreguin stated that the whole reason for the program was to increase parking turnover. Proposed purposes such as supporting police patrol operations, use in criminal investigations, and canvassing the vicinity of crime scenes did not factor in the Council discussion.

On July 11, 2017, the City Council also added a specific directive that the then-current usage policy #1-2016 be amended to include the following:

Mayor Arreguin: What I heard you say Madam City Manager is that you would support amending the policy to say that data will not be released or used for law enforcement purposes other than the purposes necessary for parking enforcement, until such time as a surveillance policy is implemented.

Regretfully, I must note that the City Council's amendment was not incorporated into policy #1-2016 or its successor policy 422 as presented in your packets, which continue to authorize third party data sharing of ALPR data with any prosecutorial or law enforcement agency (absent federal immigration officials) for any

official law enforcement purpose and the sharing of aggregated anonymized data at the discretion of the City Manager.

Both then-councilmember Worthington (who voted favorably) and councilmember Hahn (who voted not to proceed with the acquisition) stated that they expected a surveillance use policy that would strengthen the existing #1-2016, not largely replicate it.

Please review this material prior to your September meeting and address the proposed authorized uses and the third party data-sharing allowances for both specific and aggregate ALPR data.

Staff: The purpose of the ALPR equipment is to replace chalking tires.

Mayor Arreguin: According to the grant guidelines, the grant funds are restricted to the support of the GO-Berkeley parking program.

Councilmember Hahn: I looked at the adminstrative policy (01-2016) and it is leaky. The holes need to be plugged in this policy because it has a lot of holes.

Mayor Arreguin: I think it's important to keep in mind that the whole reason this process is in place is to increase turnover so people can park in our city,.

Councilmember Harrison: I'd like to see us use this data for our own traffic enforcement purposes. I'm not comfortable. I don't know if there is any way to do this with just the parking piece and not the other purposes.

Staff: The 365 day data retention is only for parking violations. It's a very Berkeley-centric program. The data is not going elsewhere.

Mayor Arreguin: What I heard you say Madam City Manager is that you would support amending the policy to say that data will not be released or used for law enforcement purposes other than the purposes necessary for parking enforcement, until such time as a surveillance policy is implemented.

Councilmember Davila: I think we should figure out a way to do this without surveillance.

Councilmember Worthington: With Councilmember's Harrison amendment on surveillance, we've had assurances that it hasn't been released, it's not planned for it be released, it's can't be released even if somebody wants too, and I predict that once we get our surveillance policy, it still won't be released to anybody.

SUBJECT: AUTOMATED LICENSE PLATE READER (ALPR)

PURPOSE

1 - This order establishes guidelines for the use of the Berkeley Police Department's Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) technology and data. ALPR technology functions by automatically capturing an image of a vehicle's license plate, transforming that image into alphanumeric characters using optical character recognition software, and storing that information, along with relevant metadata (e.g. geo-location and temporal information, as well as data about the ALPR). ALPRs may be used by the Berkeley Police Department Parking Enforcement and Traffic Units for official law enforcement purposes.

POLICY

Administration of ALPR Data

2- Any installation and maintenance of ALPR equipment, as well as ALPR data retention and access, shall be managed by the Investigations Division Captain through the Traffic Bureau. The Investigations Division Captain will assign personnel under his/her command to administer the day-to-day operation of the ALPR equipment and data.

ALPR Operation

- 3- Department personnel shall not use, or allow others to use, the ALPR equipment or database records for any unauthorized purpose.
 - a. An ALPR shall only be used for official and legitimate law enforcement business.
 - b. Reasonable suspicion or probable cause is not required before using an ALPR.
 - c. No member of this department shall operate ALPR equipment or access ALPR data without first completing department-approved training.
 - d. No ALPR operator may access California Law Enforcement Telecommunications System (CLETS) data unless otherwise authorized to do so.

ALPR Data Collection and Retention

- 4- All data and images gathered by an ALPR are for the official use of the Berkeley Police Department. Such data may contain confidential CLETS information and is not open to public review. ALPR information gathered and retained by this department may be used and shared with prosecutors or other law enforcement agencies only as permitted by law.
- The Parking Enforcement Manager is responsible for ensuring proper collection and retention of ALPR data. Technical support and assistance shall be provided by City Department of Information Technology personnel and associated ALPR system providers/vendors as identified below. IT staff will not have the ability to access or view individual records or reports, as they may contain CLETS information they are not authorized to receive. IT's role will be limited to providing initial infrastructure set-up, unless particular IT staff members have been cleared by DOJ background checks and authorized by the Chief of Police to receive ALPR records.
- 6- All ALPR data shall be stored as described in this order and thereafter shall be purged unless it has become, or it is reasonable to believe it will become, evidence in a criminal or civil action or is subject to a lawful action to produce records. In those circumstances the applicable data shall be downloaded from the server onto portable media and booked into evidence. The records will then be subject to standard evidence retention polices and statutes.
 - a. Collected images and metadata of hits will not be stored for more than 365 days. Metadata of reads will not be stored for more than 30 days. Images of reads will not be transferred to the server.

Accountability and Safeguards

- 7- All saved data will be safeguarded and protected by both procedural and technological means. The Berkeley Police Department will observe the following safeguards regarding access to and use of stored data:
 - Non-law enforcement requests for access to stored ALPR data shall be processed according to General Order R-23 in accordance with applicable law.
 - Non-law enforcement requests for information regarding a specific vehicle's license plate may be honored when the requestor is the registered owner of the vehicle in question, and when providing such

information will not invade the privacy of a third party. The requestor in such cases must provide acceptable proof of his or her identity and of ownership of the vehicle in question.

- c. ALPR data downloaded to any workstation or server shall be accessible only through a login/password-protected system capable of documenting all access of information by name, date and time.
- d. Berkeley Police personnel approved to access ALPR data under these guidelines are permitted to access the data for legitimate law enforcement purposes only, such as when the data relates to a specific criminal investigation or department-related civil or administrative action and parking enforcement.
- e. ALPR data may be released to other authorized and verified law enforcement officials and agencies for legitimate law enforcement purposes only in connection with specific criminal investigations.
- f. Aggregated ALPR data not related to specific criminal investigations shall not be released to any local, state, or federal agency or entity without the express written consent of the City Manager.
- g. Measures will be taken to ensure the accuracy of ALPR information. Errors discovered in ALPR data collected by ALPR units are marked, corrected, or deleted in accordance with the type and severity of the error in question.
- h. ALPR system audits will be conducted by personnel assigned to the Professional Standards Bureau on a regular basis, at least biennially.

Current ALPR Deployments

- 9- The Berkeley Police Department uses ALPR technology in the Parking Enforcement Unit for parking and scofflaw enforcement.
- 10- Effective 2/18/16, the Parking Enforcement Unit will utilize five (5) Parking Enforcement Go-4 vehicles equipped with ALPR units to conduct enforcement of posted time limits in commercial areas and Residential Preferential Parking (RPP) permit areas. These ALPR's will also access information in the DMV/SVS database (stolen and wanted vehicles). The

current contracted vendor for this system is PCS Mobile using Genetec ALPR technology.

- 11- The Scofflaw Enforcement program (often referred to as the "booting" program) utilizes an ALPR to scan license plates, and checks scanned "reads" against a file of vehicles which have five or more outstanding parking citations exceeding 30-days old. Typically, upon a confirmed "hit," the vehicle is immobilized with a "boot", or towed, and the owner has to pay the outstanding citations and fees in order to release the boot and/or recover their car from storage. This allows the city to recover outstanding citation fees and penalties. ALPR equipment is installed in the Parking Enforcement Unit's Scofflaw Enforcement vehicle.
- 12- The contracted vendor for the City's Scofflaw Enforcement program is currently Paylock. Paylock stores data on a secure server, and provides access to authorized personnel via Paylock's "Bootview" secure website, as described below:
 - a. All data captured by the ALPR is stored on the laptop for 30 days, and is only accessible during that period via the ALPR proprietary software. This includes reads, hits, and photographs associated with each.
- 13- When a car is booted and/or towed, the read, hit, and photographic data relating to the booting and/or towing of scofflaw vehicles is uploaded to Paylock's secure server. No other data is uploaded to Paylock's secure server.
- The City's Parking Enforcement ALPR vendor (currently Genetec) will periodically provide reports to the City of Berkeley Transportation Division's goBerkeley parking management program so that it can analyze data about parking demand. These reports will not contain any information about a vehicle's license plate number, the name of the registered owner, address of registered owner, or any other information gleaned from the license plate number associated with a particular vehicle. Rather, the reports will consist of 100 percent anonymized information using identification numbers that are not associated with a particular license plate or registered owner. The reports will provide only the date, time, location, approximate address, goBerkeley blockface ID, and RPP area in which a vehicle was observed. If a citation was not issued for an RPP or other time limit violation, the report may also provide the reason a parking enforcement

INTRODUCTION

The Police Review Commission submits its work plan for the year beginning July 2019, in compliance with the 2016 City Council directive for commissions to submit work plans at the beginning of each fiscal year.

CURRENT SITUATION AND ITS EFFECTS

The Commission adopted the attached work plan at its July 24, 2019 meeting. (M/S/C: Allamby/Calavita; Ayes: Allamby, Calavita, Chang, Earnest, Matthews, Perezvelez. Ramsey, Roberts; Noes: None; Abstain: None; Absent: Mikiten.)

The work plan includes a list of policy subjects that the Commission is or anticipates addressing in this fiscal year. The Commission is also interested in participating in more training about police procedures and tactics, staffing and organization of the police department, and training that officers receive. Additionally, the Commission would like to conduct more outreach to ensure that the public is aware of the Commission's existence and its role.

BACKGROUND

The Police Review Commission was established by ordinance in 1973 to provide for community participation in setting and reviewing police department policies, practices, and procedures, and to provide a means for prompt, impartial, and fair investigation of complaints brought by individuals against the Berkeley Police Department.

Policy work is carried out by the Commission with support from staff, while complaint investigations are handled by staff with commissioner involvement if a case proceeds to hearing. Review of police policies, practices and procedures is largely determined by the Commission itself, while complaint investigations and hearings are externally driven.

ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY

No identifiable environmental effects or opportunities are associated with the subject of this report.

POSSIBLE FUTURE ACTION

While the attached work plan reflects the Commission's priorities as of the date of its adoption, it is subject to change throughout the year should more urgent or important matters arise. These matters may take precedence as a result of Council referrals, incidents involving the police, or requests from the community.

FISCAL IMPACTS OF POSSIBLE FUTURE ACTION



Police Review Commission 2019-2020 Work Plan

Commission mission statement

The general purpose of the Police Review Commission is to provide for community participation in setting and reviewing police department policies, practices, and procedures, and to provide a means for prompt, impartial, and fair investigation of complaints brought by individuals against the Berkeley Police Department. (B.M.C. sec. 3.32.010.)

Goal #1: Review and set BPD policies, practices, and procedures.

a. Resources¹

PRC staff, BPD staff, meeting space.

b. Program activities

A policy review may be initiated by the Commission, by a City Council referral, the Police Department, or a member of the public. The initial review steps may be undertaken by the Commission, a commission subcommittee, or staff, depending on the nature and breadth of the policy, practice, or procedure in question. The review could include: holding meetings and hearings to receive input from community members; meeting with and asking questions of the BPD; studying current policies, practices, and procedures; gathering policies from other jurisdictions; and surveying the literature regarding best practices.

If a subcommittee or staff perform the initial work, it will be presented to the full Commission for review and approval.

c. Outputs

Based on the information gathered, the Commission will make a recommendation to the BPD, City Manager or City Council about a change in a policy, practice, or procedure.

Unlike most other commissions, the Police Review Commission has a staff of three City employees dedicated to supporting the Commission's work.

d. Outcomes

The desired change is a new or improved policy, practice, or procedure. If new, it will provide guidance where it did not previously exist or was not well-documented. A revised policy, practice, or procedure will reflect a change to conform with new laws, to embrace best practices that have changed since the original policy was established, or to better align with community values.

e. Specific policies, practices, or procedures to be addressed in the coming fiscal year will include ongoing, recurring, and new reviews.

Topics for which review was begun last fiscal year and will continue:

- New or revised policies and practices to address disparities in BPD pedestrian and traffic stop, citation, search, and arrest rates; and other efforts to ensure unbiased policing.
 - Specifically, a PRC Subcommittee is looking into the BPD practices of routinely asking detainees whether they are on probation or parole and, if they are, conducting searches.
- Conversion of all BPD General Orders into Lexipol policies.

Recurring topics:

- Memoranda of understanding and mutual aid pacts with other law enforcement agencies (an annual process).
- Surveillance Acquisition Policies and Surveillance Technology Use Policies, under the Surveillance Technology Use and Community Safety Ordinance, as needed when new technologies or new uses of existing technologies are proposed.

Possible new or renewed subjects of review:

- Revised policy governing the Use of Force by police officers.
- Assessment of use of body-worn cameras and re-visiting of policy recommendations made in March 2018.
- Evaluation of a proposed charter amendment to restructure the police commission and oversight staff.

Not all reviews of police policies, practices, or procedures can be anticipated in advance, as some issues are undertaken based on a request from the City Council or a civilian. Also, the PRC may undertake a review in response to particular police activity or incident.

Goal #2: Process complaints regarding individual police officer misconduct.

a. Resources

PRC staff are responsible for carrying out this goal, with critical participation by Commissioners. BPD staff are also involved.

b. Program activities

Staff will receive complaints of alleged misconduct by police officers, conduct an investigation, and, if warranted, prepare the case for a hearing before a Board of Inquiry. Rotating panels of three Commissioners serve as the BOI, except in death cases, where the Commission sits as a whole.

Cases may be closed without a hearing; the reasons for such closures include: mediation between the complainant and subject officer is completed; the complainant withdraws the complaint; or the complainant does not cooperate in the investigation.

c. Outputs

Following a BOI hearing, a Findings Report will be sent to the Chief of Police and City Manager, who may rely on the PRC's findings in determining whether to impose discipline.

Based on prior years, it is anticipated that roughly eight BOI hearings will be held in the coming fiscal year.

d. Outcomes

By providing a venue for investigation of complaints that is separate from the Police Department, civilians may view the process as more objective than investigations conducted by the Police Department internally. Addressing problematic behavior identified by the PRC may result in corrective action or discipline. Police officers' awareness of the PRC's complaint process may influence their behavior in a positive way.

Goal #3: Participate in training.

a. Resources

PRC staff and BPD staff

b. Program activities

Presently, Commissioners are not subject to any mandatory or prescribed course of training, other than the training that all commission chairs and vice-chairs must complete. Each Commissioner receives a 2-hour orientation from PRC staff covering topics relevant to service on the commission, the role of Commissioners and PRC staff in reviewing policy and processing complaints, and service on Boards of Inquiry. Commissioners are to meet with the Chief of Police and schedule a ridealong.

Currently, additional training on the organization of the BPD, police policies, relevant law, and officer training occurs sporadically. Topics presented to the PRC in the past year include BPD de-escalation training and response of BPD in conjunction with the Mobile Crisis Team to persons in mental health crisis.

In light of an October 2018 Council referral asking the PRC to explore mandatory training requirements, the Commission has asked the PRC Chair and PRC Officer to arrange for ongoing training.

c. Outputs

The results will be Commissioners who are better and more uniformly knowledgeable about police procedures, staffing and organization, training, tactics, and relevant law.

d. Outcomes

The outcome will be policy reviews and Board of Inquiry decisions that are based on a deep understanding of police work and police-community relations such that both the police and the community will have more confidence in the work of the PRC.

Goal #4: Conduct outreach activities.

a. Resources

PRC staff, printing of materials

b. Program activities

The Commission, as a whole or through a subcommittee, will develop and implement activities and strategies to better inform the community about the PRC's mission and services, including its policy review function and intake of civilian complaints about officer misconduct as an agency independent of the Police Department.

c. Outputs

The results will include increased presence at community fairs and other events; speaking to community groups, churches, and the like; holding Commission meetings at various locations; updated literature describing the Commission's work; a revamped and expanded website.

d. Outcomes

The outcome will be larger numbers of community members who are aware of the PRC and informed about its services and activities.

Goal #5: Revise PRC Regulations for Handling Complaints Against Police Officers as needed.

a. Resources

PRC staff and BPD staff.

b. Program activities

The complaint process, from intake through the BOI hearing, is governed by regulations promulgated by the PRC. The need to revise the regulations may arise when, for example: a deficiency is discovered; a way to streamline the process is identified; or a change is desired.

Regulation changes may be initiated by the Commission or by staff. The Commission as a whole may consider a revision, or establish a subcommittee for this purpose.

Depending on the specific change, a meet-and-confer with the police union may be required.

c. Outputs

The result will be amended PRC Regulations.

d. Outcomes

Amended Regulations will result in a process for handling complaints that is clearer; more efficient; conforms to current law; and reflects community values.

California aids sex workers who report crimes, use condoms

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — A new California law would protect sex workers from arrest if they report crimes or are caught with condoms.

Democratic Sen. Scott Wiener of San Francisco said his legislation is the first in the nation to provide such health and safety protections.

Gov. Gavin Newsom signed the measure into law on Tuesday, but SB233 will take effect in January.

It protects workers from arrest for misdemeanor-level sex-related crimes if they report that they are victims or witnesses to serious or violent felonies, such as rape. It also bars police and prosecutors from using condoms as evidence that the person is engaged in sex work.

Wiener said current law deters sex workers from reporting crimes or protecting themselves from sexually transmitted diseases.

"When sex workers believe that reporting violent crimes or carrying condoms will get them arrested, they simply won't take these steps, and we will all be less safe as a result," he said in a statement.

The California District Attorneys Association said it understands the dangers to sex workers and victims of human trafficking, but said the measure "is bad public policy and sets a bad precedent. There are already sufficient measures in place to protect these individuals, and this measure protects the buyers of sex trafficking as well as the workers."

The American Civil Liberties Union and groups representing sex workers said the change will particularly benefit street-based sex workers, women of color and transgender sex workers.

"Allowing sex workers to carry condoms and report violent offenses will be lifesaving," said Pearl Callahan, outreach director for the Sex Workers Outreach Project-Sacramento.

Gavin Newsom signs California bill tightening rules for police shootings

SACRAMENTO — California tightened its rules Monday for when police officers can open fire on suspects, giving the state one of the toughest use-of-force standards in the country.

Gov. Gavin Newsom signed <u>AB392</u>, which directs police to "use deadly force only when necessary in defense of human life" and, when possible, to use techniques to de-escalate a confrontation before shooting.

The bill does not explicitly define "necessary," though courts could consider the actions of both the officer and the suspect when determining whether a shooting was justified. The law will take effect Jan. 1.

"We are doing something today that stretches the boundaries of possibility," Newsom said at a signing ceremony, where he was joined by activists whose family members have been killed in police shootings. "It sends a message to people all across this country that they can do more and they can do better to meet this moment in their respective states."

The measure was the result of months of contentious negotiations involving law enforcement groups, which warned that far-reaching changes could endanger officers, and civil rights groups demanding that California address the disproportionate impact of police shootings on communities of color.

California police killed 146 people in 2018, according to the state Justice Department. That was a drop from 172 deaths in 2017 and 157 in 2016.

Assemblywoman Shirley Weber, the San Diego Democrat who carried the bill, said Monday that she hoped it would bring "a little bit of peace" to families that have lost loved ones in police shootings.

"For 400 years, people of color have often had a different kind of justice than others in this nation," Weber said. "And after 400 years of demonstrating our commitment and our humanity to this nation, we deserve fairness and justice."

Weber introduced legislation to raise the standard for using deadly force last year after the fatal shooting by Sacramento police of Stephon Clark.

The unarmed 22-year-old, holding only a cell phone, was killed in his grandmother's backyard in south Sacramento in March 2018, generating national outrage. In March, the Sacramento County district attorney declined to charge the two officers who shot Clark.

Backed by the American Civil Liberties Union of California and activists, Weber argued that current law on when police could open fire was too broad. That standard, established by the U.S. Supreme Court in a pair of cases, considers whether a "reasonable" officer in a similar situation would have acted the same way.

Law enforcement organizations lobbied against the bill's language directing police to use deadly force "only when necessary in defense of human life." They said it would put officers in danger by causing them to second-guess themselves in circumstances that call for split-second decisions. But Democratic legislators, sympathetic to civil rights groups that insisted police needed stricter guidelines, pushed them to negotiate.

Talks derailed several times, and at one point there were <u>two competing proposals</u> before lawmakers. Newsom and legislative leaders intervened this spring, <u>working out the final</u> details of the standard that the governor signed Monday.

Statewide organizations representing police chiefs and officers moved to a neutral position on the deal, though many local police unions remained opposed.

Some activist groups that had lobbied for the bill <u>also dropped their support</u>, arguing that proponents had made too many changes to appease law enforcement, including eliminating a requirement that police exhaust all alternatives before shooting someone.

Laurie Robinson, a criminology professor at George Mason University who led a task force on policing under then-President Barack Obama, said that despite those changes, AB392 is nevertheless a "bold step" that goes beyond what most states have done.

She advised local leaders to maintain a public dialogue about use of force with their police departments and community members as the law is implemented, because many officers and residents will be nervous about whether the new standard is working.

"You can't bring change simply by punitive measures. You ideally want to bring people along by culture change," Robinson said.

That could be addressed by a law enforcement-backed companion bill, <u>SB230</u>, which would order the state Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training to develop new guidelines and courses on police use of force.

It would also spell out 20 elements that every law enforcement agency would have to write into its internal policies, including a requirement that officers use de-escalation techniques and other alternatives to force when feasible.

Police groups, which did not attend the signing ceremony Monday, emphasized in a statement that their companion bill represented a "unified solution" with AB392 and must also be approved.

"Once both bills are signed and take effect, the real work can begin," said Ron Lawrence, president of the California Police Chiefs Association.

The training measure, by state Sen. Anna Caballero, D-Salinas, has passed the Senate and is moving through the Assembly. But in a sign of how sensitive the issue remains, the ACLU has raised objections that it could undermine the new use-of-force law by setting a definition of "feasible," which is not included in AB392.

Lawmakers have a month before the end of the session in September to send Caballero's bill to Newsom's desk. After the ceremony Monday, the governor said he looked forward to signing SB230 and was committed "to address these issues in a more systemic way," including by increasing funding for the police training commission by \$20 million in this year's budget.

Activists said they would continue to push for more accountability in California, such as mandating drug tests of officers who fatally shoot a suspect and requiring independent investigations of the shootings.

"There's a lot of people in our community who feel they're just giving us crumbs," said Kori McCoy, whose younger brother, Willie, was <u>killed by Vallejo police in February</u> after they found him asleep in a car with a handgun on his lap.

McCoy said it brings him some comfort that California now has a law forcing officers to "find a peaceful resolution to these situations whenever they can."

"This isn't a club you want to be a part of," McCoy said.
