2. Adopt an Ordinance Amending Berkeley Municipal Code Chapter 2.99 to Prohibit City Use of Face Recognition Technology (Item Contains Revised Material)

Referred: May 13, 2019 Due: October 28, 2019


Recommendation: Refer to the City Manager to develop alternative code compliance measures for nontraditional live/work spaces, in order to improve residential safety without displacing existing communities. Given the current shortage of affordable housing, Staff should consider how to enact a policy of leniency towards existing structures which may not be in complete compliance with city permits. Staff should seek methods to incentivize incremental safety renovations without exposing communities to eviction concerns.

Nature of Incident:

Ebony Jones had kidnapped her wife in her vehicle, and struck and threatened her wife while driving around in the vehicle. Jones was located at the above location and refused to comply with officers' commands to exit the vehicle.

Summary and justification of the Actions of Officer(s) Involved:

Jones eventually exited the vehicle and physically resisted officers' attempts to handcuff her. Less-lethal rounds were not immediately effective in obtaining compliance from Jones. In order to overcome her resistance and gain compliance without further escalation of force, I discharged OC spray at her face for approximately 2-3 seconds from a distance of approximately 7 feet. Jones then surrendered to officers and allowed herself to be handcuffed.
