





Dear Chief M Meehan;

I am writing this letter to complaint and get a response regarding your officers "erroneous" completion of the Notice to Appear Form. I was stopped allegedly for failure to stop at a stop sign, at Hopkins and Gilman, at around 8:00 a.m. on Sunday morning. May 31, 20015. After I returned home that day, I noticed that on the Notice to Appear Form, on the Race column the officer entered "O", which I believe stand for "Others—neither black nor white. I am offended and insulted by this designation. The citation is attached as Exhibit "A". I am black and not "others' No one who looks at me would designate me anything else other than black. This immediately prompted in my mind why would a well trained officer would make such a blatant "mistake".

I understand that the Notice to Appear Form, where the governmental authorities collect the race of citizens the police encounter may be useful statistical information for policies related to law enforcement. In fact, I have heard or read statistical information that suggest police officers disprportionatley stop (arrest) blacks for minor traffic infractions. Correctly collected information may provide some useful information to train and, if necessary, to reign on bad officers. If the data collected is tampered or improperly gathered, the information loses it reliability/credibility except for those who cook the numbers to prove their point.

The question still remains why this particular officer made this obvious "mistake". I assume, at the minimum, your officers are trained on know how to fill out this form and are familiar with various racial categories. I hate to entertain the notion that this may be a deliberate policy and practice of the police department/city of Berkeley to rig the statistics regarding the demographic of their traffic citations and that the officer is merely faithfully implementing such policy.
